

#### THE TAX SALE.

#### Large Amount of Land Bid in by the County.

The tax sale, the first under the resent law governing the subject. was held this forenoon, as advertised. A large quantity of the land advertised, that which was not wanted by private individuals either for holding or speculation, was bid in by the county at 10 per cent interest from the present owners in case of redemp-

tion The majority of the land was bid in at 20 per cent straight, the maximum legal rate for redemption on mount of the tax with the penalties and the costs added. The competition for a good many pieces of the lands advertised was genuine and spirited. Iways use it. been communicated with but vouchsafe no reply.


#### Assaulted His Wife.
