Kaiser Has Been a Soldier 26 Years.

Berlin, Feb. 29.—In view of the warlike utterances with which Emperor William is accustomed to startle Europe at regular intervals, it is interesting to note that his majesty has been a soldier just 26 years, today being the anniversary of his entrance in the First regiment of the guards in 1877. In the quarter of a century that has passed since he became a soldier the emperor has never seen active service. He attaches the greatest importance to the military side of his career, however, and in accordance with custom the anniversary of his entrance in the guards was commemorated at Potsdam this morning with a service in the garrison church. This afternoon the emperor reviewed the regiment, the German crown prince partaking in the parade march.
