

## COUNCIL

CITY MAY BUY A TEN TON STEAM ROLLER.

Representative of Manufacturing Co., Gives Detailed Description of Machine, Which Costs \$3750-Main Francis Protest Against Improving Byers' Lane.

There were present at the council meeting last night Recorder Fitz Gerald, City Attorney Carter, Street Commissioner Fee, Fire Chief Withee, and Councilmen Sommerville, Clopton Johnson, Switzler and Dickson.
