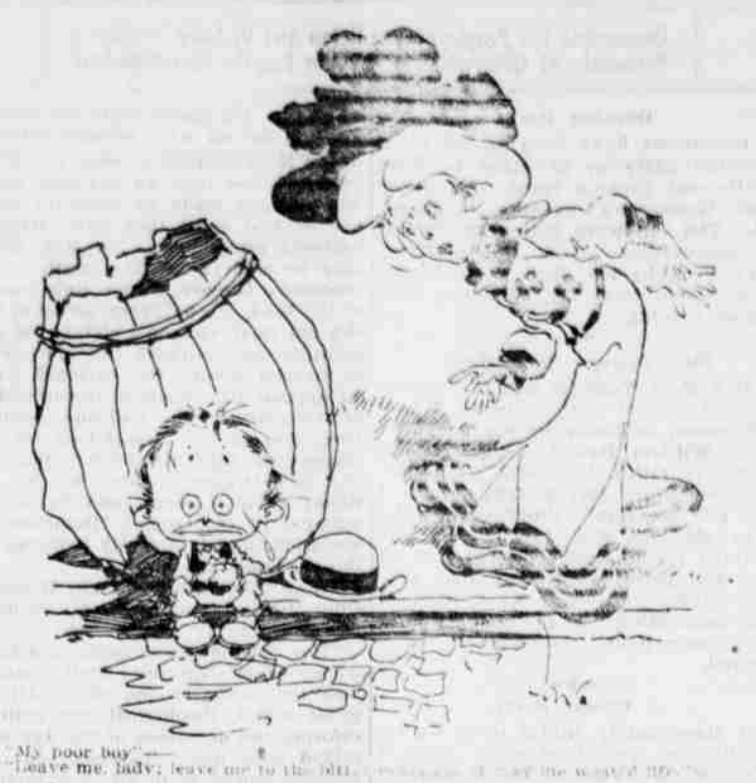

Goose lake is said to have been named for the fact that in early days myriads of wild geese dotted its waters and fed on the natural meadows that bordered its shores. They have not entirely abandoned the place yet, and ducks and brandts and swans and other feathered game still frequent the place.
