OREGON EXPENSES

TOTAL APPROPRIATION WILL BE OVER \$1,341,500.

Following is Partial List Showing Expenses of Maintaining the Departments of the State and for the Capitol Building.

Salem, Or., Feb. 17.—Three appropriation bills will be introduced in the legislature tomorrow, to provide for the expense of the state departments and state institutions for the ensuing two years. The total appropriations recommended will be a little over \$1,341,500. The bills will be considered in committee of the whole in each of the houses and will then go to the governor. They will probably not get through both houses before Thursday.

Following are the appropriations requested for the payment of the expenses of the maintenance of the executive, administrative, judicial, educational and other departments of the state, for public printing, for the capitol building, for various boards, commissions, commissioners and officers:

Payment of salary of governor \$2,000.

Salary of private secretary to the governor, including his salary as clerk of the board of trustees of the Oregon state insane asylum, clerk of the public building commission and clerk of the board of capitol building commissioners, \$4,200.

Salary of clerk and stenographer in executive department, \$1,800.

Salary of secretary of state, \$3,000.

Salaries of clerks and stenographers in office of secretary of state, \$16,720.

Salaries of additional clerks in the office of secretary of state, required by the "corporation tax law," \$3,500.

Salary of state treasurer, \$1,500.

Salaries of clerks and stenographers in the office of the state treasurer, \$6,800.

Salaries of additional clerks in the office of the state treasurer required by the "corporation tax law," and the "inheritance tax law," \$1,200.

Salaries of the three justices of the supreme court, clerk and deputy clerks, official reporter, stenographers, and clerks for the justices, services of bailiffs and general and contingent expenses of the supreme court of the state of Oregon, \$46,000.

Salaries of the judges of circuit courts and prosecuting attorneys and deputies, \$155,500.

Payment of salary of attorney-general, \$6,000.

Payment of salary of clerk and assistant in the office of the attorney-general, \$1,200.

Salary of superintendent of public instruction, \$6,000.

Payment of traveling expenses of superintendent of public instruction, \$1,800.

Salaries of clerks and stenographers in the office of the superintendent of public instruction, \$3,000.

Expenses of teachers' associations, \$500.

Salary of state librarian, \$2,000.

Purchase of books, book cases, papers, etc., for payment of expenses of cataloguing and for the payment of contingent expenses of state library, \$5,000.

Salary of governor, \$1,000, of secretary of state and state treasurer each, \$500 a year, for their services in supervising public works, public buildings, etc., for which compensation is not otherwise provided, \$4,000.

Salaries of the chief janitor, three assistant janitors, fireman, night watchman, messenger and gardener at the capitol building and grounds, \$12,000.

Salaries of pilot commissioners and secretary of board of pilot commissioners, \$2,400.

Salaries of health officers of Astoria, Coos Bay, Gardiner and Yaquina, \$4,400.

Salary and clerk hire of state land agent, \$3,600.

Salary and expenses of master fish warden, and salary and expenses of deputy fish warden, \$11,400.

Salaries of members and general and contingent expenses of the Oregon domestic animal commission, \$5,000.

Payment of services and expenses of members and officers, and general and contingent expenses of state board of horticulture, \$9,000.

Payment of expenses of public printing, ruling and binding and purchase of paper, including "uniform series of school record books and blanks," provided for public schools by department of education and printing and binding election blanks, compiling, printing and binding election laws, and purchase of election supplies, \$50,000.

Payment of expenses of printing and binding supreme court reports, viz., balance due for vol. 40, \$200; and vols. 51, 52, 53, 54, 55, 600 each, at \$3 per volume, \$9,200.

Payment of general and contingent expenses of state capitol building and grounds and various departments thereof, i. e., for water, gas, expressage, stationery, telegraphing, rental of telephones, postage, etc., required in the ordinary course of business to maintain said building, grounds and departments, \$17,000.

Payment of expense of painting the interior walls of third floor and interior of dome of capitol building, \$800.

Payment of expense of lighting state capitol building, \$7,400.

Purchase of fuel for heating the state capitol building, \$2,500.

Payment of expenses of publication of proclamations, notices of warrant calls, etc., \$600.

Total, \$408,220.
