PLANS OF ATLANTIC SQUADRON

Gun Practice May be Followed by Cruise in Europe.

Washington, Feb. 18.-Upon the result of the three months' hard work at the target, practice about to be un dertaken will depend the summer plans of the North Atlantic squadron. The fleet is working out an elaborate and progressive set of exercises and drills devised by the general board, the purpose being to familiarize the officers with naval movements on a larger scale than has ever before been attempted in the United States navy. The fleet has worked through the program step by step, and the three-months' program now in execution will determine whether or not the gun work of the ships has been so far perfected as to warrant the beginning of the next phase, namely, a long-distance cruise in the fleet formation. If this work should be un dertaken next summer, of which Sec-retary Moody is by no means certain, the North Atlantic squadron will make directly for the Azores and if the combined movement is successful up to that point the ships may go on as far as Lisbon, but it is not te-tended that they shall visit Northern Europe under any conditions.
