SPEAKER ONE DAY

COMMENDABLE RECORD OF MOODY OF OREGON.

Presided Over the House for One Day

—Is Accused of Nervousness by Colleagues—Very Dignified Speaker.

Washington, March 3.—For one whole day Representative Malcolm A. Moody has been speaker of the house of representatives. Throughout Sunday, February 22, he presided over the house, by designation of Speaker Henderson, and exhibited all the dignity and solemnity that the occasion demanded. The house had assembled to hear eulogies on the late Representative Tongue and two other departed members. At the stroke of 12 Mr. Moody brought down the gavel with a thump, and the house was in order. At his order, the chaplain offered prayer, and then for a brief minute Mr. Moody relinquished the chair to Mr. Coombs, of California, while he returned to the floor to offer the resolution authorizing the eulogizing of his late colleague. Immediately upon its adoption, he returned to the speaker's desk, where he remained until the adjournment. Prior to the assembling of the house, Mr. Moody came in for considerable "joshing" at the hands of his colleagues. He had never before presided over the house, and was laughingly accused of nervousness. One of his colleagues went so far as to charge the Oregon man with having burned midnight oil in studying up methods of procedure and looking into precedent, but, of course, this was all in good humor. It can be truthfully said that no man ever presided over the house with more dignity than did Mr. Moody, and, whatever may have been the facts as to study, he made no breaks. His day as speaker was one of entire success.

RELIEF FOR SETTLERS.

Moody's Bill Passes Senate and Will Probably Become Law Before Adjournment of Congress.

Washington, March 3.—Senator Spooner late Saturday evening secured the passage through the senate of Representative Moody's bill providing that all settlers on odd sections within the conflicting grant to the Northern Pacific Railroad and The Dalles military wagon road, in Eastern Oregon, who had made improvements upon said lands and afterward forfeited them under the decision of the supreme court in the case of Wilcox against the Eastern Oregon Land Company, shall, in making final proof upon homestead entries made for other lands, be given credit for the period of time of their bona fide residence upon and the amount of improvement upon the lands for which they were unable to complete title. But all such persons must avail themselves of this provision within two years.

This act does not apply to persons who have received the benefits of the homestead law and received title to other lands, since being deprived of their first entry. The senate struck out the provision requiring one year's residence upon the second homestead, in accordance with the wish of the settlers, and if the filibuster in the house does not prevent the reference of the bill to congress, it will become a law before adjournment.

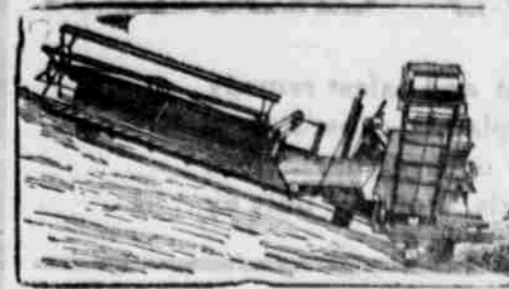
WAR-TIME SPEAKER.

He entered congress before he was 30, and quickly became a leader. During the stirring times from 1861 to 1863 he presided over the house as speaker. He entered congress as a democrat, but when the Missouri Compromise was repealed he permanently broke with his old party associates and became the congressional leader of the newly-formed republican party.

During his single term as speaker, Mr. Graw presided over three sessions of the house. It is not, however, upon his record as speaker that Mr. Graw looks back as the most important chapter in his public career, for he has a right to be considered as the author of the Homestead act, which went into operation Jan. 1, 1863. From 1871 to 1876 Mr. Graw was president of the International and Great Northern Railroad Company of Texas. President Hayes offered him the mission to Russia in 1879, which he declined.

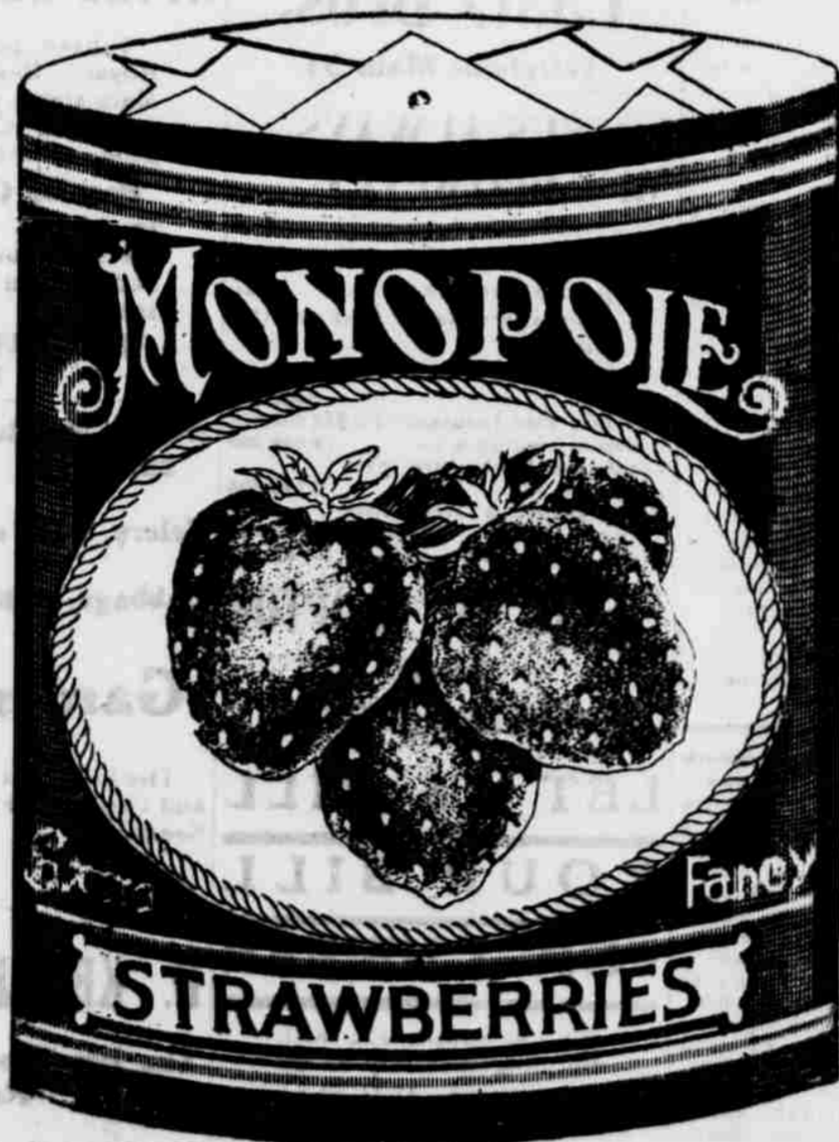
