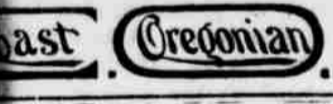

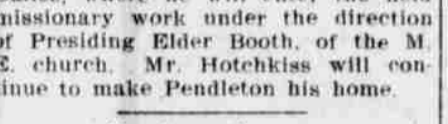
High Class Vaudeville Performance to Be Given Two Nights This Week.
