### GENERAL NEWS.

The Ohio River has reached the danger line at Cincinnati and is still rising.

The Princess Louise of Saxony has finally parted from Gron for the sake of her children.

The island of Guam is said to have been considerably changed as a result of the earthquake September 22.

Japanese are migrating to the coast from Hawaii in large numbers, owing to the financial depression in the islands.

Governor Dole in his last message to the Hawaii legislature, declares that leprosy is being stamped from the islands.

The governor of Colorado has called out the state troops to protect the scabs at work in the reduction works at Colorado City.

The brakemen and trainmen on the Wabash road have gone out on a strike because they were not given an advance in wages.

Falling in their effort to have a new superintendent removed, the trained nurses of the New York Eye and Ear Infirmary struck Tuesday.

Juan Rial, a mail carrier between Toas and Tries Piedres, N. M., was lost in the blizzard Saturday and has not yet been found. He has undoubtedly been frozen to death.

William J. Bryan has informed his intimate friends in New York that if the gold democrats triumph in the next national convention, he will lead his followers from the hall and nominate an independent ticket that will enlist the support of the radicals.

Edward Lieuluken, wanted in Minneapolis for embezzlement, was arrested Tuesday in Portland.

James Kinney, of Portland, has been sentenced to four years in the penitentiary for kidnapping Porter Yett, a small boy.

George W. Winslow, of the Willamette Iron and Steel Works, was severely injured Tuesday by the collapse of a derrick.

A very hard specimen of transparent stone has been found on the rough bluffs of the Snake river, about 20 miles from Pasco.

The Bayer county grand jury has returned three indictments against the editor and publisher of the Baker City Herald, for libel.

D. W. and James R. Kenney are held in custody at Orting, Wash., awaiting requisition papers to be returned to Salem on the charge of perjury.

Eugene Cottell, the 4-year-old son of Dr. W. I. Cottell, of Portland, was crushed to death by an electric car, Tuesday evening, while playing on the track.

Guy A. London, a 15-year-old boy of North Yakima, was shot and mortally wounded Tuesday night, while playing as a burglar at the home of Thomas Wheeler.

Chris Benson, who murdered Deputy Sheriff Morrell, of Olympia, Sunday afternoon, in escaping from jail, was captured at Elma, Wash., Tuesday evening.

### AGRICULTURAL INSTITUTE.

Wasco County Discusses the Fruit-growing Industry.

The Dalles, March 4.—An agricultural institute is in session at Hood River and among other questions discussed will be that of how to fertilize orchard soil by growing forage plants and turning them under the sod. This is a question that has been very largely given attention in the East and Middle Western states and is considered of great importance. The old-time story of the tree pests will also be gone over. Among those in attendance are Dr. James Withycombe, director of the Oregon Agricultural College at Corvallis; Professor A. L. Kinsley, state chemist; Professor A. B. Cordley, state entomologist, and Professor A. C. Kent, state dairy instructor.
