## NEED MORE MONEY

WESTERN STATES BURDENED  
BY ST. LOUIS FAIR.

Will Make Further Appropriations for the Lewis and Clark Exposition—All Western States Enthusiastic—List of Field Workers.

Portland, March 6.—The Lewis and Clark fair will not receive as much money from Western states this year as will be needed. This certainly is becoming more and more manifest as the sessions of Western legislatures draw to the close. There is no reason for discouragement, however, because larger sums can be secured in 1905 than could possibly be secured at this time. The great disadvantage to the fair will be that the money will be available late and the progress of the exposition will thereby be retarded. Yet it will be conceded that additional money can be used to good purpose at a late hour. Oregon appropriated money in 1901 for the Buffalo exposition, only a short time before the exposition opened.

Western legislatures have felt the burden of their appropriations this year for the fair at St. Louis, and have put off the Lewis and Clark exposition either with small sums or with promise of appropriations two years hence. These legislatures will all have adjourned by the 12th of this month, except Missouri and Nebraska. Governor Geer is now on a mission to those states in behalf of the 1905 fair. Idaho is the only state which has appropriated money for the Lewis and Clark exposition. The money from Idaho and the probable sums from other states will be as follows:

### NEW BARBER EXAMINERS.

Governor Chamberlain Will Make Two Appointments.

Portland, March 6.—The state board of barber examiners will soon have two new members. The term of S. H. Howard, one of the oldest members of the board, expired this week, and F. D. Rogers is about to hand in his resignation, leaving H. G. Meyer the remaining member of the examining board. J. C. Wels, vice-president of the Barbers' Union is the choice of his union for the position, and his friends say that Governor Chamberlain looks with favor upon his appointment.

The unions in Salem, Astoria and Baker City will have some voice in the selection of the other member, who will take Rogers' place. The executive committees of the outside unions will consult with the committee of the Portland union, and the new member will be jointly selected. All of the former boards of barber examiners have been composed of one journeyman and two employing barbers, but by the recent law the order will be reversed, and the union men form a majority.
