PREVENTED POTATO FAMINE, Italian Gardeners in High Favor at Lakeview-Vegetables Lower All

Lakeview, Or., March 10.—A company of Italian vegetable gardeners have gone into business and bid fair to drive out the American gardeners living along the east side of Goose Lake, who in years past have suppli-ed the town with vegetables. The Italians are conducting business on a more extensive scale, and while there is a scarcity of vegetables they have cut the price of potatoes to \$1.50 per cwt., and other things in proportion. Gardeners threatened to call on them en masse and request them to move on. The Italians are all citizens and some are native born Americans, The old gardeners are not meeting with much sympathy from the public, who appreciate the fact that the Italians shipped a carload of seed potatoes here from Reno, Nev., last spring, at a cost of nearly \$1,000, besides the risk, and by raising about 100 tons of potatoes saved the community from a potato famine. As \$1.50 per cwt, is a pretty good living price for potatoes in any country, they see no reason why the Italians should combine with our farmer gardeners to raise it. The Italians have held down prices all along the line all season. Though their prices would be considered high in the Willamette valley, they are lower than usual here and the sympa-

thy of the public is with them. Assistant to Dr. Lorenz Coming. New York, March 10.-Dr. Freder ic Muller, the assistant of Dr. Adolf Lorenz ,the famous Viennese surgeon is a passenger on the steamship Bar-barossa, which is due here today or tomorrow. Dr. Muller will remain in New York about five days, after which he will proceed to Chicago, where he will look after the future treatment of Lolita Armour, whom Dr. Lorenz operated on while there. Dr. Muller will then remain in Chicago, where he will become professor of orthopedic surgery in the medical school of the University of Chicago. During his brief stay in this city, prior to leaving for Chicago, Dr. Muller will operate on a number of Jewish child-ren of the East Side at the request of influential Jewish friends here.
