GENERAL NEWS.

Vienna is threatened with a strike of chimney sweeps.
 In a head-end collision at Danville, Va., Tuesday, two men were killed and several passengers injured.
 Thirty tons of cauliflowers from Italy are now being landed daily at Folkestone for the London market.
 In Sweden the riksdag has proposed a special tax on "punch," the national beverage. It will increase the retail price by 25 per cent.
 The total national expenditure of Great Britain for next year, according to estimates just presented, will amount to \$750,000,000.
 A rich deposit of iron ore has been discovered near Wrightsville, Pa., considered one of the most important ever made in that state.
 Preparations are being made for taking a census of the Transvaal at the end of the year in connection with a census scheme for the whole of South Africa.
 Overcome with joy at his unexpected release from prison, a convict collapsed and died as he stepped out of the jail door to freedom at Leutschau, Hungary.
 Henry Roro, a wealthy Cuban planter who gave the greater portion of his fortune in aid of the Cuban revolution, is now confined in an insane asylum at New York.
 Henry Thomas, a negro who attempted to assault the 10-year-old daughter of Porter Keen, was lynched near Parish, Fla., Sunday night, after having admitted his guilt.
 One hundred relatives and friends of Miss Margaret Commersford, of Newark, N. J., intend to give up a portion of their cuticle to supply 300 square inches of skin for the girl, who was seriously injured in the collision at the Clifton avenue crossing on February 19.

PACIFIC NORTHWEST NEWS.

The state grange is now in session at Portland, with a large attendance.
 The 17th infantry will embark at San Francisco, instead of Portland, on its departure for the Philippines.
 Gable is the third candidate for the county seat of Columbia county, St. Helens and Ranier being the other two.
 A \$3,000 lodge building will be built by the Masons and Odd Fellows of Woodlawn, a Portland suburb, this spring.
 Houses are more scarce in Portland suburban villages, this spring, than ever before in the history of the city.
 Utah has appropriated \$6,000 for the purpose of making the national irrigation congress, which meets in Ogden on September 8-11, a success.
 E. L. Stevens, sentenced to two years for larceny, from Baker county, has broken out with a virulent case of smallpox, in the penitentiary.
 Anton Olson, a miner of Kalama, was blown 30 feet through the air Tuesday by the explosion of a stick of dynamite, which he was thawing out.
 Fred Metzger, of Portland, has been sued by Leslie G. Merrill for \$5,000 for false imprisonment. Merrill was accused of stealing money from Metzger's butcher shop.
 Attorneys for Ples Armstrong, the Baker county murderer, are now trying to get a change of venue on the ground that the accused is not safe from mob violence in Baker county.
 Governor McBride, of Washington, has refused to grant extradition papers to the Kinney brothers, wanted in Portland for falsely swearing to the age of a 15-year-old girl whom one of them married.
 The income from the O'Keefe-Britt fight in Portland was \$4,200. The Pastime club took \$1,550 of this for their arrangement of the fight. O'Keefe gets 60 per cent, or \$1,700, and Britt 40 per cent, or \$700.

TO EXTEND SYSTEM

NEW BATTERIES, BOXES AND 'PHONES TO BE PLACED.

Telephone Company Expect to Have the Completed System in Full Operation by April 10.

All the material has arrived for the extension of the telephone system in this place, and today five men are busily engaged under the direction of W. H. Hatley, in laying cables, setting poles, stringing wires and placing 'phones.

Among the workmen is an expert—Peter Anderson, sent here by the company from Spokane. It is the intention of Mr. Hatley to have the completed system in full operation by April 10. There will be 82 new 'phones put in, and the new boxes and batteries are here, along with the remainder of the material.

The bulk of the new material is composed of the 82 new 'phones mentioned, the batteries for the same, 30 miles of wire, 980 feet of cable (100 wires in each cable) 90 cross-arms, 2,800 insulators, four cable boxes and platforms, two new sections of switch board (each for 100 'phones), six 35-foot poles and 25 25-foot poles, and other material which is merely accessory to the things mentioned. The cables will carry "the lead" from the central office to Main and Court streets, from central to Alta, and from central to Johnson.

The capacity of the plant which will be in operation April 10, will allow of a further expansion of 400 'phones without bringing another dollar's worth of material into the city. The new directory will be issued immediately upon the connection and numbering of the 'phones, which will be of course immediately after April 10.

The cost of the material alone used in the expansion, is \$1,079.05. This is entirely exclusive of the running expenses of the regular exchange. Whatever repairs go into the regular exchange (the old 'phones and old wires and poles, new boxes, etc.) the expense is outside of the amount named.

The differences in rates are shown in the following: Those on two-party lines are now paying \$2 and \$2.50 per month. They will be changed to individual lines without any change in price. Those now on 10-party lines within a distance of two blocks of the central office will be put on two-party line, \$1.50. Those between two and four blocks will be put on four-party lines at the same rate they have heretofore been on ten-party lines, \$1 and \$1.50. Everything beyond four blocks may belong to six-party lines instead of ten-party as heretofore, at the same price, \$1 and \$1.50.

Residence party line rates will be \$1 per month, business party line rates, \$1.50. Individual line rates will be reduced from \$3 to \$2.50, and from \$2.50 to \$2. The system will remain under the management of Mr. Hatley, who will have charge of the outside work and toll lines, and of Miss Carrie Moussu, who will have charge of the business management and of the central office.
