NEW MILL FOR GRANDE RONDE.

Fire Which Swept Away Old Buildings Was Blessing in Disguise.

Island City, March 16.-The Pioneer Milling Company, which owns flouring mills in La Grande and in Union, will soon be better prepared to operin making breadstuffs, in Island City than it has been before. The new mill and elevator cover 89x90 feet, four stories high. The building is enclosed, the entire great structure having been erected from bottom to in top in four weeks. The bulk of the machinery is already at hand. There are six stands of rollers and the entire machinery equipment is of the latest brand. Water power is obtained from the Grande Ronde river, operating a 23-inch turbine wheel and developing 85 horse power.

The mill will begin running smoothy on May 1 and will dally manufacture 200 barrels of high-grade flour, whole wheat flour, graham and other choice breadstuffs.

The elevator department of the mill will store 65,000 bushels of wheat. The entire mill building will be
