ADDITIONAL NEWS OF DIS-ASTER IN SOUTH SEAS.

Island of Hao, Morakau and Hiquera Virtually Washed Away-600 Is landers Perished.

San Francisco, Cal., March 18 .-The steam Mariposa which arrived from Australia lately brought addi-tional news of the typhoon and tidal wave at Pearl Island group in the middle of January. The French government investigated the disaster and found that about 600 islanders pershed during the storm. The property loss is half a million dollars. After the wind had subsided and the

waters receded hundreds of drowned natives were found tied to trees about the places. Hiqueru, one of the islands visited by the deluge, was best able to understand its force, as its highest place is but 12 feet above the ocean. The residents flocked to the heights and sought safety by binding themselves to rocks and trees. There they remained for three or four days. during which the storm swept over the dreadful scene.

The islands of Hao, Morakau and Hiqueru are virtually washed away, as they are present a little above the sea level and are destitute of vege tation. On them a man cannot subsist, as the soil has vanished. The cocoanut trees are dried up and dead. On the awful night of January 15, during the darkness and driving downpour of rain, parents tied their little children to their backs and sought safety. Over their heads rolled a mighty wave, and when the surges retreated the infants and half grown boys and girls succumbed. A father or mother would vainly endeavor to retain the corpses of the dead, but usually at length had to abandon them.

It was to the credit of Americans that relief from thirst came in the form of condensed water. With primitive machinery 200 gallons of fresh water was distilled daily for several days.
