THEY ARE STAYERS

GOOD CLASS OF IMMIGRANTS COMING WEST.

Homeseekers Now Coming to Oregon and Washington Are Americans and Are Prepared to Meet All Obstacles

"We have come to stay," seems to be the motto of those who are availing themselves of the settlers' rates at present in force to the Pacific Northwest. Notwithstanding the hundreds arriving almost daily in this city, local officials report the sale of fewer tickets than usual toward the East. This means that those who are making the "out-trip" are "locating" at once, and not doing as has too often been the case in the past—taking one look and turning back.

The reason for this, it is claimed, is because the present westbound population is much better informed as to actual conditions than were those of two years ago. They do not come expecting to find a wilderness and are not disappointed when compelled to pay for what they get.

For the most part these homeseekers are Americans, men and women born in the United States. They do not require education along special lines before they can adapt themselves to the conditions they find to face them when they leave the immigrant cars and strike out to make their way in this, to them, new world. They know what to expect, and are prepared to meet the obstacles and to overcome them.—Oregon Daily Journal.

HALGARTH DIED.

Verdict Shows That Both the Senior and Junior Gray Were to Blame.

Archie Halgarth, who was shot by Woodson Gray, about five miles east of Elgin, Friday morning, died Saturday evening. Coroner J. C. Henry, of this city, impowered E. B. Morelock, justice of the peace of Elgin, to act as coroner and he impaneled a jury yesterday afternoon and after reviewing the evidence brought a verdict which is substantially as follows: "We, the coroner's jury, find that the deceased, Archie Halgarth, came to his death from the effects of a bullet from a revolver in the hands of Woodson Gray, and that the deceased was hastened to his death by knife stabs inflicted in the back by Wade Gray. Wade Gray is the 14-year-old son of Woodson Gray. Both the old man Gray and his son, who were taken to Union Saturday for safekeeping were brought back to Elgin yesterday and are now there in the city jail.

The funeral of Archie Halgarth took place yesterday afternoon from the Christian church, of which he was a member. The funeral was conducted under the auspices of the Masonic fraternity, of which he was also a member. Gray's preliminary examination will take place this afternoon or Thursday, it had not been decided late last evening. The case bids fair to be a very stubbornly contested one as friends on both sides are making every effort to have all the facts in the case developed.—Observer.

Officers Re-Elected.

Church, treasurer. Inasmuch as the state appropriation for this district will come to the Grande Ronde society this year, the directors hope for a meeting that will be a big success. Several radical changes in the conduct of the fair are to be made, one of which will be the elimination of skin games.—La Grande Chronicle.

Yale's Baseball Schedule.

New Haven, Conn., March 25.—The Yale baseball team lined up this afternoon for the first game of the season. It was a practice contest, the opposing team being the American League club from Washington. The regular collegiate schedule will be inaugurated April 8, when the Yale team will face Georgetown for the first game of regular spring trip in the South. The wearers of the Blue expect a good season. For the first time in a decade Yale will play two games with the University of Pennsylvania. Princeton and Harvard will also be met on the diamond in addition to the usual number of games with the smaller colleges and universities.
