ELECTRIC RAILWAYS.

A Big System Will be Put in Between Central West Virginia and Pitts-

Morgantown, W. Va., March 28 .-With the beginning of the construc-tion here last week of the new Morgantown electric railway a start was made on what will be one of the biggest electric rallway systems in the United States, a line between Central West Virginia and Pittsburg. The Morgantown street car line will be a link in the gigantic system that will extend from Buckhannon, W. Va., a town high up in the mountains of Up-shur county, through the valleys to the great industrial center of Western Pennsylvania. The road will be upward of 200 miles long and a consider able part of it has been already completed or is in an advanced stage of construction. The aggregate capital of the roads to be welded into one continuous line between the points in-dicated is over \$100,000,000.

Most Notable Astronomical Event of Year Occurs Tonight.

MARS IN OPPOSITION

Washington, D. C., March 28. most notable event of the year is the opposition of Mars, which occurs tonight. On April 1 the distance of Mars will be a minimum, being then 59,000,000 miles

The opposition is so circumstanced. however, that astronomers will have some favorable conditions for study-ing Martian problems. The northern polar cap will be visible, and doubtless many observations will be made of it by numerous observers.

The satellites of Mars, discovered Professor Hall at the Naval Observatory, probably will be beyond the reach of that telescope in the present position of the planet, but they may be visible to the more powerful telescopes of the Lick Observatory. Many problems are now studied by astronomers with large telescopes which the measurement of satellites is one

Other lines of study relate to the diameter of the planet by night and by daylight, and drawings of the numerous markings noted upon the surface of the sister planet.

OREGON MODEL LAW

BILL RECENTLY PASSED BY STATE LEGISLATURE.

An Act to Protect the Birds of the State From Destruction-Persons Convicted Liable to \$100 Fine.

The bill recently passed by the Oregon legislature is what is known as the "Model Law." being recommended by the national bird associations, and

sprinted in full below:
Section 1. No person shall, within the state of Oregon, kill or catch, or have in his or her possession. Ilving or dead, any wild bird, other than a game bird, or purchase, offer, or expose for sale, transport, or ship with-in or without the state, any such wild In or without the state, any such wild bird after it has been killed or caught except as permitted in this act. No part of the plumage, skin or body of any bird protected by this section shall be sold or had in possession for sale. For the purposes of this act the following only shall be considered game birds: The anatidae, commonly known as swans, geese, brant, and river and sea ducks; the Ralidae, commonly known as ralls, coots, mud hens, and gallinules; the Limicolac, commonly known as shore birds, plovers, surf birds, snipe, woodcock, sandpipers, tattlers and curlews; the Gallinae, commonly known as wild turkeys, grouse, prairie chickens,

pheasants, partridges and qualls. Sec. 2. No person shall, within the state of Oregon, take or needlessly destroy the nest or the eggs of any wild bird, other than a game bird, or have such nest or eggs in his or her possession, except as permitted by

this act. Every person convicted of violation of any of the provisions of this act shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$5.00 and not more than \$100, and in default of the pay ment of the fine imposed shall be im prisoned is the county jail in the county where the offense was com-

mitted at the rate of \$1.00 for each day of the fine imposed. Sec. 4. Sections 1, 2 and 3, of this act shall not apply to any person holding a certificate giving the right to take birds, their nests, or eggs for scientific purposes, as provided for in section 5 of this act.

5. Certificates shall be grant by the president of the state agricultural college of Oregon and the president of the University of Ore gon to any properly accredited per-sons of the age of 15 years or upward, permitting the holder thereof to col-lect birds, their nests or eggs, for strictly scientific purposes only. In order to obtain such certificate the

applicant for the same must present to the person or persons having the power to grant said certificate writ-ten testimonial from two well-known scientific men, certifying to the good character and fitness of said applicant to be intrusted with such privilege; must pay to the said game warden one dollar to defray the expenses attending the granting of such certificate; and must file with said game warden a properly executed bond in warden a properly executed bond, in the sum of \$200, signed by two re-sponsible citizens of the state as sureties. On proof that the holder of such certificate has killed any bird, or taken the nest or eggs of any bird, for other than scientific purposes, this bond shall be forfeited to the state, and the certificate become void, and he shall be further subject for each offense to the penalties provid-ed therefor in section 3 of this act.

Sec. 6. The certificates authorized by this act shall be in force for one year only from date of issue, and shall

not be transferable.

Sec. 7. The English or European house sparrow (passer domesticus) is not included among the birds pro-

are hereby repealed

Inasmuch as certain wild birds of this state are in need of immediate protection, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this act shall be in force from and after its approval by the governor.
