




### The Wheat Trade.

Portland, April 2.-There are no signs of any revival in the wheat market; business is very quiet and very few lots are offered for sale. Stocks held in the interior unsold will hardly reach 24 million bushels. Exporters and millers are all well sup-plied with wheat and are not anxious to buy at present asking prices. Holders no doubt have come to real tize that they held on too long and see now a decline of 6 cents per bushel from the top of the market. There is nothing doing whatever for export and no incentive for the shippers to lay in a supply of wheat, the few vessels chartered the balance of the season are amply looked after and no detention for want of wheat will be noted. Farmers at present are all busy seeding and looking after spring work and in a great many sections have finished. The fall-sown grain is full 60 per cent short of last year and unless the same is put into spring work we will have a very short crop, We quote club, 72473c per bushel, blue stem, 82c, valley 78c and no mar-ket at these figures. Many in the trade quote 3 cents lower than the shore. above.

**COMMERCE** - TRADE San Francsico, April 2.-Shipping grades of wheat remain about steady in price, but actual trading is of but small volume. The firmness of holders in their belief that prices will be higher, prevents concessions, and in consequence curtails business. The exporters on the other hand, assert that present conditions in the Eug-lish market do not admit of them pay-AT \$6.85 PER HUNDRED. ing these asking prices. For the same reason the Australian demand is limited. There are only four ships in port under engagement to load grain, and loading progresses slowly. The high price of milling wheat is causing millers to bring wheat from Oregon and Washington. Within a few weeks large lots have come to hand and the bulk of which is going to interior points for milling purposes. The speculative market was devoid of special interest and prices for No. 1 shipping are  $1.37\frac{1}{2}@1.42\frac{1}{2}$ , milling,  $1.47\frac{1}{2}@1.55$  per cental. quotations are for the animal on the hoof. Cows are worth \$3.75, steers, \$4.35 and live hogs \$6.85. These are the haures offered by the buyers this


