This firm is a vigorous partisan of the claims of the two breeds of sheep mentioned, believing that they are the best animal ever introduced into the northwest. Their opinion is that the nearer to a thoroughbred the better-not merely high grade, but thoroughbred if possible. Of their 25,000 sheep in this county, 6,000 are thoroughbreds. They claim for this sheep, moreover, that not only is it the best wool sheep, but that it is as good a mutton animal as has ever been introduced here. The Smith Company will begin shearing May 1.
