Baker City, April 8 .- Prof. L. D. Edwards, of this city, is the latest pub-lisher of musical compositions to startle the local sphere of melody. He has recently caused to be published and yet more recently placed

#### DOGS KILL SHEEP.

Sheepmen of Salem Lose Many Animals-Will Sue to Recover Their Losses.

A great deal of disturbance has A great real of disturbance has been going on lately among sheepmen up the river in the vicinity of the Pettyjohn place, on account of the depredations of sheep-killing dogs. The trouble has been going on for some time, and has resulted in the loss of nearly 100 sheep.

Sunday morning, about daybreak, one of the most terriore slaughters of sheep occurred on the Pettyjohn place, which has ever been known in this section of the state and all on ac-count of the thirst of one dog for blood. The dog is owned by the blood. The dog is owned by the widow Pingwald, and Sunday morning it attacked a band of sheep owned by O. G. Savage, of this city. Seven-teen sheep were killed outright and a large number of others were badly mangled or their legs broken so that a number of them were killed and more will be later. Fully 50 head wer lost as the result of the attack. and a number of others wounded, together 64 sheep being enaer killed or wounded. Mr. Savage shot the murderous beast as soon as he reached the scene of the slaughter. He re-ports it one of the most sickening sights he had ever witnessed, the ground being strewn with dead sheep and lambs, while the others were lying around struggling or walking with the flock, their hams or shoulders being torn open and leaving a trail of blood behind them.
