**PENDLETON AHEAD.**

Amount Realized From Art Exhibit Exceeds That of Any Other Town.

Mrs. F. F. Wamsley, chairman of the committee having the management of the Turner art exhibit, is in receipt of a letter from Horace K. Turner, written at Boston, acknowledging the receipt of a draft for \$272.23, the same being the amount of the patronage accorded the exhibit by Pendleton. The letter also states that the amount exceeds that from any other town in which the exhibit has been made. With the letter came a copy of a circular giving the terms upon which certain prizes are awarded for first, second, third and fourth volume of receipts from different cities. The first prize is of \$200 worth of pictures, frames and casts to that city turning in the largest receipts from the Turner exhibit. So it looks altogether probable that Pendleton will surely capture the second, if not the first prize.
