It is rubber tired, and and silver. axles and fifth wheel are roller-bear-ing and dust proof. The body of the vehicle is absolutely dust proof as well. Every particle of metal enter-ing into its composition is annealed steel except the silver mountings. The solid ornamental work is either iacquered steel, bronze or silver mounted. The hangings are em-broidered satin, hand woven. The broidered satin, hand woven. rollers carrying the casket are of ma-hogany, and also ball-bearing. The monogram of the firm, in hand-carved relief, decorates the driver's box. The vehicle was manufactured by Sayers & Scoville, Cincinnati, Ohio.
