FOR WAGON ROAD.

Over \$1000 Has Been Raised to Build Shorter Route From Fruita to Joseph.

Fruita, Ore., April 24.—Over \$1000 has been raised in Fruita and Joseph for a wagon road from Fruita to the Sheep creek divide summit, the object being to get a short wagon route from this part of the Innaha country in Joseph. A route has been roughly mapped out over the divide which would make the distance from Fruita to Joseph less than 40 miles. It is 55 by the road now followed. Joseph is west by northwest from Fruita. The present road goes a long distance north and northeast, to Innaha, and then has to swing back nearly southwest an equal distance to get to Joseph.

Joseph merchants are pleased with the idea on account of the better facilities. T. F. Rich, a leading merchant of Fruita, is one of the promoters of the wagon road project.

Annual Purchasing Trip.

John P. Wilbur, of Union, is in the city and before returning to Union he will tour nearly the entire wool-producing district. Mr. Wilbur represents the Union Woolen Mills, and is on his annual purchasing trip to the mills. He will buy in Umatilla county alone 300,000 pounds of wool if he can get it at not too high a figure. It is a matter of price only, he being perfectly satisfied in advance that the quality will be standard. Mr. Wilbur states that in his opinion wool will open this year from one and a half to two cents less than the closing price of last year. Mr. Wilbur's first destination beyond this point is the North Yakima country. He states that the Union Woolen Mills are putting in machinery now that will double their producing capacity from the opening day of this year's operations.
