GENERAL NEWS.

The United States will not join in the proposed anti-Russian action.

China has sent a formal note to Russia refusing to grant her demands in regard to the evacuation of Manchuria.

Phillip Doblin, who gave sensational testimony in the Holland submarine bribery cases, was committed to Bellevue hospital Monday, for examination as to his sanity.

Two thousand persons are destitute and camping on the foothills near Pisagua, in the province of Taraposa, Chile, as a result of a fire which destroyed that city lately.

Gen. Miles, of the army, in his report to the secretary of war, directs attention to the acts of reconcentration by Gen. Bell which, he claims, are in direct violation of the law.

For the first time in the history of American athletics, an all-American football team is to visit Ireland and England this summer in an attempt to gain international honors.

By an explosion of molten metal five men were horribly burned, two of them probably fatally at Vesta furnace, Marietta, Pa., early Monday morning. The accident was caused by a wet projectile being shot into the cupola.

Two-thirds of the Presbyterian churches of the United States have voted in favor of revising their confession of faith. The subject will be finally disposed of by the general assembly, which meets in Los Angeles next month.

John Wilkerson, a miner in the Goldconda at Sumpter, fell 325 feet Monday and was instantly killed.

The Spokane baseball team, which has heretofore been called "bunch strassers," has been dubbed the "Inlanders."

A. M. Johnson, an old-time purser on a river steamer, committed suicide at Napa, Monday. His accounts were short \$100.

At a special school election at Astoria Monday, for the purpose of refunding a \$27,000 school district debt, only 12 votes were cast.

Rev. S. G. Adams, of Sacramento, preached a sermon on intemperance among women last Sunday, as a result of which the congregation is going to ask for his resignation.

The county jail record of Baker county shows that Pleasant Armstrong, the Haines murderer, has been in that institution several times before, for disturbing the peace.

Bessie Knecht, of Salt Lake, woke from her sleep of 57 days Sunday. The doctors attribute her trouble to an abscess on the brain. When she went to sleep she weighed 127 pounds. She now weighs only 86.

A challenge to a joint debate has been issued by the democratic campaign managers of the first congressional district, to Binger Hermann, Mr. Reames, the democratic nominee, will debate issues with Mr. Hermann.

Capitalists of St. Paul interested in Echo—J. G. Camp Will Finish Preliminary Survey About Thursday—Jack Rabbit Banquet Planned.

Echo, Ore., April 27.—Mr. Sabin in company with W. W. Cotter, secretary and general counsel of the O. R. & N., were here yesterday looking over the country. They took a drive through the Umatilla meadows and up Butter creek. Both were loud in their praise of the magnificent and wonderful resources of this vicinity. They think this a wonderful dairy and poultry country. Mr. Cotton also says that Mr. Benson who is a leading attorney of St. Paul and who was here a few days ago in the interest of several capitalists, expressed himself as delighted with this climate and the possibilities of this vicinity and that there was no doubt but that his visit would bring beneficial results.
