

Trout Culture as a Business.

The first requirement of commercial trout culture is a good supply of cold running water, which must be under perfect control. In the neigh-borhood of Cape Cod the conditions appear particularly favorable, if we may judge from the number and prosperity of the trout farms. One man started with the siender equipment of 1000 fry in 1894. Today he has four separate farms, containing altogether two and one-half miles of troughs, "ponds" as they are called, in which to keep the fish. Besides this he has several hatcheries and packing houses, and no less than three gasoline engines for chopping food for the fish. Each trough, which is about 140 feet long by eight feet wide, contains from one to two feet of water, and holds 5000 fish averaging eight inches in length, the total number of fish on the place being nearly half a million.


