GENERAL NEWS.

The Baltimore city election will be contested by the republicans.

Five thousand employes in the quarries around Bedford, Ind., are on strike for a wage adjustment.

The United States Christian Herald of New York, has sent \$5,000 to China for the relief of the famine district.

Hannah Anderson is dead at Elgin, Ill. She was a professional nurse and attended at the birth of King Edward.

A strike of 2,750 employes of the Great Northern railway at St. Paul is expected to be authorized next Sunday.

The building trades strike at Springfield, Ill., is virtually at an end, the strikers having gained nearly all their demands.

Bulgaria is in a defiant attitude toward the porte, officially resenting his protests about the condition of affairs in that province.

Forty persons are under indictment in New York City charged with defrauding insurance companies of several million dollars.

One Chicago hotel chartered a tug and took its soiled linen to Kenosha, Wis., to be cleaned. The laundry workers' strike continues.

A strike of stationary engineers is causing much embarrassment among the Chicago packing houses, but has not resulted in any shutdowns.

There have so far been seven deaths from typhoid fever at Stanford University during the present epidemic, and several students are now ill.

An English tobacco trust has purchased for \$2,000,000 the Williams Tobacco Company, of Richmond, Va., which has been for many years its rival in South Africa and Australia.

PACIFIC NORTHWEST NEWS.

P. T. Bushman, a wholesale fish dealer, of Tacoma, committed suicide by shooting himself Thursday.

Mabel H. Williams, aged 16, of Everett, Wash., was married to Louis J. Henderson, aged 70, Thursday.

De Yopp, a well-known Tacoma liveryman, was fatally injured Thursday by a horse falling upon him.

R. D. Hume, of Curry county, Oregon, has pledged \$1,000 to cancel the remaining indebtedness on Willamette University at Salem.

The saloon men of Everett, Wash., have refused to contribute to the fund being raised for the entertainment of the presidential party.

A merger of all the California powder manufacturing is now being formed, headed by the Dupont Powder Works, of Wilmington, Del.

A black worm resembling a wheat wire worm, except in color, is devastating the hop plants in Willamette valley, by eating away the roots.

The 14-year-old son of C. A. Morser, of Portland, was caught by a street car Thursday and dragged a distance of 40 feet, receiving probably fatal injuries.

Some of the citizens of Walla Walla threaten to enjoin the school district from building the new high school, for which \$50,000 in warrants have been issued.

An examination of the Marion county dairies by the stock inspector, discloses the fact that 80 per cent of them are being conducted on unsanitary principles.

Clatsop county has asked for bids for a 70-foot steel drawbridge and 1,500 feet of trestle over the Lewis and Clark river, a short distance above its mouth.

Leon and Lucy Caron, of Spokane, have been sentenced to three years each at McNeil's Island, for bringing French girls into the United States for immoral purposes.

Joseph Stroberg, a prisoner serving a five-year sentence for assault, was pardoned Thursday by Governor Chamberlain. Stroberg is from Josephine county, 70 years old and is losing his mind.

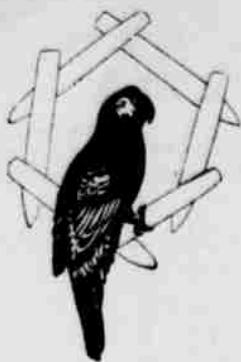

Albanian Chiefs Banished — King George Would Annex Albania.

Constantinople, May 8.—An order for the arrest and banishment of 27 Albanian chiefs has been issued by Marshal Ruschdi, on demand of the Russian ambassador.

It was also announced here this morning that the consuls of the various powers represented at Athens, had had an audience with Prince George of Greece, and compelled him, in view of the difficulty in the Balkans, not to press his pet scheme of the annexation of Albania to Greece.
