FOOT HILL WHEAT.

Is Looking Fair, But Needs Considerable Moisture, Says Thomas Copeland.

"Wheat in the foothill district is looking just fair and considerable warm weather and more rain is badly needed," said Thomas Copeland to the Walla Walla Statesman. Mr. Copeland is farming several hundred acres south of Walla Walla in what is known as the foothill district. "The deficiency in precipitation is nearly as great as it is in Walla Walla, something over three inches since the first of the year. This will have to be made up largely in the next month or wheat in the lighter soil district and uplands will suffer considerable damage.

"A slight shower fell during the night at my place, but it was scarcely enough to call a rain though green stuff is greatly refreshed by it."
