GENERAL NEWS.

There is bubonic plague in Peru. G. G. Howland, manager of the New York Herald, is dead. There is some plague on the western coast of Mexico. A head-end collision at Utica, N. Y., resulted in the death of three persons. In a row between strikers and non-union men at Fremont, O., two union men were shot and killed. Semi-official advices indicate that there will be an extra session of congress called for November next. The American canal commissioners express complete confidence that the canal treaty will be ratified by Colombia. The chief of police of Colorado Springs has been indicted by the grand jury, charged with permitting the escape of prisoners. A street duel in Yazoo, Miss., between four men resulted in the death of T. A. and D. Kelly and Doyle Dorsey. Politics was at the bottom of the trouble. The fact exists that the powers of Europe are exerting every effort to prevent an open rebellion of the Balkan provinces from Turkey. The Balkan situation is regarded as extremely acute. Henry C. Ide, of the Philippine commission, declares that one of the most effective measures of relief for the islands would be the removal of the tariff on articles imported into the United States. William Jennings Bryan, in a signed interview, declares it is impossible for Grover Cleveland to receive another democratic nomination for president. He made no expression of opinion as to who would be the nominee in 1904.

PACIFIC NORTHWEST NEWS.

The Citizens' Bank of Baker City, has been converted into a national bank. Spokane barbers are discussing a raise in the price of hair cutting from 25c to 35c. No grand marshal has yet been selected for Portland's parade on the occasion of the president's visit. The German ship Peru has sailed for Falmouth, England, with 1,792,000 feet of Oregon lumber, valued at \$26,000. The May apportionment of school funds for Washington amounts to \$906,685, or \$200,000 more than ever before. The O. R. & N. is putting in a new hose house and several hundred feet of new hose, for fire protection at Baker City. Mrs. S. G. Henry, of Spokane, was seriously injured near Lewiston, by having her buggy blown off the grade by a heavy wind Sunday. The crusade against gambling at Wallace, Idaho, has resulted in the conviction of "Bob" Campbell, a noted gambler, who stood trial. A \$200 nugget was found in a recent clean-up at Cow creek, in Malheur county. Two men in six weeks took out \$1,589, with one giant. Earl Levingood, aged 18 months, of Anaconda, Mont., broke his neck Sunday by falling out of a swing and catching his chin in the rope. Ed Wagnitz, county assessor of Deer Lodge county, Montana, was drowned Saturday while estimating sawlogs in the Missoula river, near Plains. Baker County mines yielded \$200,000 in gold during the month of April. Several Spokane Chinamen have cut off their queues and denounced the ways of their forefathers, to become Americans. Mrs. Julia Kahlert, of Kootenai, Idaho, died at the Sacred Heart hospital in Spokane, Sunday, of pemphigus. She was literally flayed alive, there remaining not a particle of skin on her body at the time of death. It is the most remarkable case on record.

Cheap Fire Insurance.

M. H. Rice, of Freewater, Umatilla county agent for the Oregon Fire Relief Association of McMinnville, was in the city yesterday evening, returning home on the 6 o'clock train. Mr. Rice reports considerable activity in his business this spring. The total amount of fire insurance carried in Oregon is \$100,000,000, while this association carries over \$13,000,000, or one-eighth of the total. It has been organized eight years, has paid 619 losses, levied 11 assessments, each of which were but 15 per cent of the cost of the yearly premiums in the stock companies. It is strictly mutual and the vote of the membership controls its policy.
