GROWING WEATHER

CROP CONDITIONS EXCELLENT IN EASTERN OREGON. Very Little Fall Wheat Reseeded—Rain Badly Needed in Harney and Malheur—Light Showers in Umatilla and Union Counties. Fine growing weather prevailed during the week in the Willamette valley north of Lane county and along the coast. In Lane county, Southern Oregon, and in all sections east of the Cascades, the weather has been too dry and the nights too cool for rapid growth. Frost has occurred frequently in the dry sections, and they have probably done considerable damage to fruit, early varieties of which are now in bloom in Eastern Oregon and late varieties in Southern Oregon. Along the coast and in the Willamette valley, north of Linn county, reports all indicate excellent fruit prospects. In Linn county the fruit outlook is good, except that a few correspondents report damage to cherries, caused either by blight or frost. Fall wheat continues thrifty and promising. Spring wheat is coming up slowly. The only reports of damage to the grain crop come from Sherman county, where some reseeding has been done on account of injury by cut worms. Pasturage is now generally good, and clover, alfalfa and vetch have made good progress. Timothy has made a rather slow growth. Hops generally are doing fairly well, but the crop is quite uneven; some yards being forward, while others are quite backward. Complaints are more numerous than usual regarding missing hills. Corn planting is nearly completed, and field potatoes are being planted. Gardens are in excellent condition. Columbia River Valley. Dufur, Wasco county, Alex Strachan—Fore part of week warm, latter part cold with high winds; frost on morning of 7th; no damage to fruit; spring sown grain now showing green and fall grain has made good growth; summer fallowing nearly done; good rain would be beneficial. Grass Valley, Sherman county, Geo. B. Bourhill—Fall wheat very backward; considerable portion of it has been sown, and some left is very thin; cut worms have done some damage in places; spring wheat looking well, but late; farmers just about finished seeding; sharp frost Wednesday night, but have heard of no damage done. Condon, Gilliam county, John F. Reischer—Weather very favorable for crops; spring wheat nearly all in and most of it up; the ground is getting dry, and rain would be beneficial; season very late, but prospects fair for good crops. Douglas, Morrow county, H. W. Grable—First of week warm; latter part cold, with high winds; crops backward, but otherwise promising. Milton, Umatilla county, F. A. Sikes—Warm early in week; changed to cooler on Wednesday, followed by a light shower; crops looking well, but in need of rain; some fruits slightly damaged by cold; pastures need more rain. Plateau Region. Imbler, Union county, L. Billings—Warm days and cool, frosty nights; fruit trees in bloom; grass and pasture growing slowly; some few fields of beets are up and have a good stand; seeding still in progress; severe wind Wednesday; soil dry. Owyhee, Malheur county, J. M. Harris—Warm and dry; rain badly needed; range very poor, irrigating in progress; alfalfa is growing finely; prospects favorable for fruit. Klamath Agency, Klamath county, Geo. W. Loosley—Weather warm and dry; rain needed, grass growing nicely; meadow grass about six inches high; stock on the ranges are getting about all the feed they can eat; horses are shedding and beginning to fatten.
