COMMERCE - TRADE

LOCAL MARKET NOTES BUT TWO TRIFLING CHANGES.

Strawberries Are Cheaper, Cabbages Cost Somewhat More Than a Week Ago—The Grain Market is Extremely Dull and Hangs Upon the Incoming Crop.

Everything is dead in the local market as far as changes are concerned. The whole list lies the same as this time last year. Only two changes are noted in the entire local list, strawberries having fallen from 15 cents per box to 12 1/2 cents, and cabbage having risen from 4 to 5 cents.

Everything else is the same. The hide market is dead, only two small loads have come in to the city dealers. Wheat is dead and no deals are being made nor will be made until the spring market opens. It is the lull before the storm, and a change is expected in the near future. Next week may see some changes.

The Wheat Trade. Portland, May 21.—Markets show no improvement over the preceding week, holders are selling more freely and are willing to take price offered them by buyers. Stocks in first hands are becoming quite scarce for any good size parcel, as most of them have been sold during the past 30 days. A large amount of wheat remains in the country unsold, but the same is in small parcels and buyers do not care to bother with the same, unless the size is large enough to secure. The cables denote a great deal of inactivity abroad. Quotations are without change and range for club wheat 71 cents; blue stem, 74 cents; and valley, 75 cents per bushel.

San Francisco, May 21.—There is nothing doing in the cash wheat market here, and the season of 1902-3 is over. Exporters have all finished their charters and are now waiting the approach of the coming harvest. The same is not as promising as one month ago, when all the wise sages claimed 1,000,000 tons of wheat for this season. It would be difficult at

the present time to find any one who claims the crop will be as large, and it is doubtful if the same will exceed the one of the previous season. In the absence of any urgent business, quotations range from \$1.33 to \$1.35 per cental for shipping grades, and milling from \$1.45 to \$1.50.

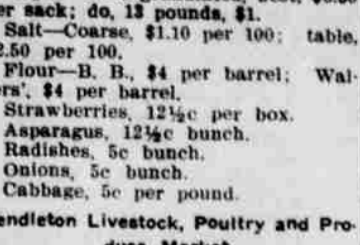

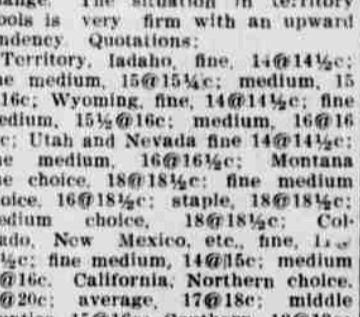

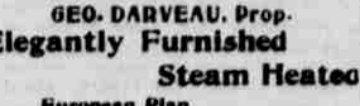
