NORTHWEST SANGERFEST.

German Societies to Meet in Walla Walla June 5.

Walla Walla, May 23.—Following quickly upon the visit of the president to this city next Monday and the great celebration arranged for the event, comes another unusually interesting and unique assemblage. The German singing societies of the Northwest will meet here June 5 for a four-days' singing jubilee, and the largest gathering of trained singers ever attempted in the Western country. The meeting will be known as the second annual sangerfest of the North Pacific Sangerbund, comprising trained singers from Seattle, Tacoma, Portland, Whatcom, Fairhaven, Walla Walla and other places. The gathering will be held under the auspices of the local Mannerchor Club, the society of German singers.

The sangerfest consists of a splendid program of special music, parades and public gatherings. The public functions will be held at the opera house, a social concert being on the program for Saturday evening. The parade will occur Sunday afternoon. The annual business sessions will occur at Germania hall, the election of officers being the feature. Ample entertainment is being provided by the local committees.

The North Pacific Sangerbund was organized nearly two years ago at Whatcom, the first business session being held July 21, 1902. Last year the society was entertained at Seattle for four days, the attendance being several hundred. On account of the large attendance from this city, the second meeting was given to Walla Walla. The officers are: President, J. M. Fiedler, Walla Walla; first vice-president, E. Hippoly, Portland; second vice-president, A. Blechschmidt, Whatcom; secretary, John Bachbold, Walla Walla; treasurer, R. Siburg, Tacoma; custodian, Carl Neuss, Seattle; musical director, Edna S. Fischer, Walla Walla.

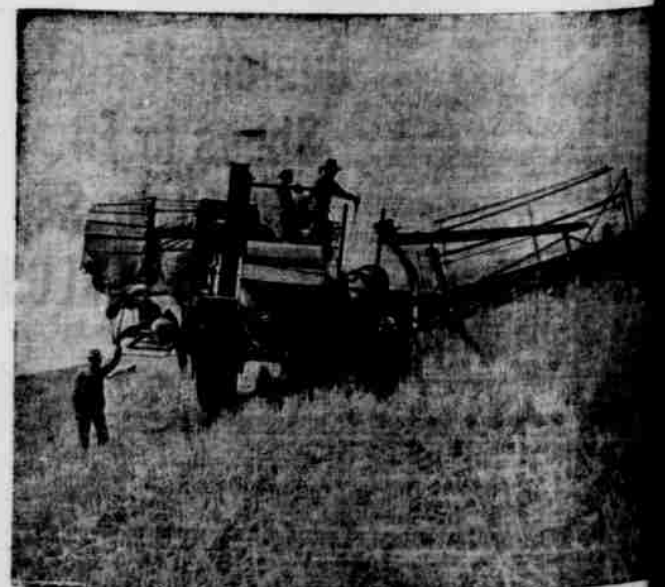
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
