## OBSERVE SABBATH

REV. JONATHAN EDWARDS  
ON SUNDAY DESECRATION.

Able Address Before the Congregational Convention at Seattle—Views of a Thoughtful, Scholarly Man, on This Important Subject.

The Seattle Sunday Times of May 17, contained the following able address by Rev. Jonathan Edwards of this city, delivered before the Congregational convention in that city, on the "Sunday Question on the Pacific Coast":

"God bestowed four gifts of supreme value upon mankind through the Hebrews. They were the Holy Scriptures, the monotheistic conception of God, the blessed Gospel of Jesus Christ, and the Sabbath, or Sunday, or the Lord's day, which I think the most scriptural and significant name, under the new economy; it is also the legal title of the first day of the week.

"Sunday is at least incidentally recognized in the Federal constitution by the clause in Art. I, Section 7:

"If any bill shall not be returned by the president within 10 days (Sunday excepted) after it shall have been presented to him, the same shall be a law in like manner as if he had signed it."

"Congress never meets on Sunday, except of necessity at the close of the short term. The president is never inaugurated on Sunday. The supreme and federal courts are closed. If the Fourth of July falls on Sunday the observance of it is put off till Monday. The revised statutes of the United States sustains the observance of Sunday in certain particulars—the cadets at West Point and Naval Academy students are exempted from study on Sunday; like the Fourth of July and Christmas day, Sunday is excluded from the computation in certain bankruptcy proceedings, and provision is made that army chaplains shall hold religious services at least once each Lord's day. (Dr. Schaaf, Hom. Rev., December, 1887.)

"In order to present facts and not theories on the subject I solicited answers to the following questions from representative men in the various states on the coast:

### The Questions.

"1. Wherein does the Sunday question differ on this coast as compared with other sections—the East or interior?"

"2. Are the laws defective?"

"3. What is the commercial and public sentiment in your state or city?"

"4. What are the most common methods of Sabbath desecration?"

"5. What efforts have been made for reform, and with what success?"

"6. What is the problem relative to the Sunday question, and the outlook?"

"Over a score of responses were received from California, Idaho, Washington, Nevada and Montana. In answer to the first question three testified that there was not much difference. 'Not as much as some Eastern people are fond of asserting.' But the large majority declared that there was, on the Pacific coast, more open indifference and carelessness, less regard for the Lord's day, less reverence for all things sacred, less disposition to formal observance in religious circles, and more laxity on the part of professing Christians in all religious matters. Several intimated that the temptations were greater because of opportunities, environments and public opinion. Three of the states on this coast, or the Northwest, having no Sunday laws, would in itself make the question a distinctive one with us.

### Laws Are Inadequate.

The almost unanimous testimony from the states of Washington and Oregon is that the laws are adequate, but far from being observed.

"As to commercial and public sentiment, a few believe that it is opposed to restriction in Sunday games and business. Several testify to the prevalence of indifference. But the majority believe that the commercial interests represented in legitimate business are favorable to restraints. 'Pretty solidly in favor of a day of rest,' is the testimony of a leading San Francisco pastor. The general opinion seems to be that the commercial sentiment is in advance of public sentiment, but business men lack the convictions necessary to aid in the enforcement of laws. It is gratifying to know that in Nevada labor unions insist on having Sunday as a day of rest, or free from toil.

### Sabbath Desecration.

"As the most common methods of Sabbath desecration, nearly all mentioned working, baseball games, picnics, excursions—many of them under the auspices of lodges and other organizations—open saloons and theaters of inferior grade, driving, wheeling, riding on railroad trains and street cars, and neglect of public worship. 'Devotion to athletic and aquatic sports, recreations and secular entertainments.'

"As to efforts for reform, the testimonies of 'Nothing. Practically none. No concerted action. Very little, and sadly intermittent. No special effort. Only the teachings of the pulpit, and protests of the Pastors' Association when something especially notorious is proposed.' Only a few testify that saloons have been repeatedly closed on Sunday, but they don't stay closed."

### TO PROTECT BIRDS.

Agreement Not to Use Feathers and Plumes for Millinery Purposes.

New York, May 25.—What various women's societies and other organizations have failed to accomplish in the way of preventing the use of birds in the decoration of feminine headgear is about to be effected by the milliners themselves. By agreement, which has been made between the Millinery Merchants' Protective Association of New York and the Audubon Society, there is to be an absolute withdrawal from the trade and in the trimming of hats of those species of birds the use of which the Audubon Society and the American Ornithologists' Union have tried so long to suppress.

According to this agreement, which was formally announced to the millinery trade today, and will remain in force for three years, the members of the Millinery Association pledge themselves to "abstain from the importation, manufacture, purchase or sale of gulls, terns, grebes, humming birds and song birds." These restrictions are to apply to the birds irrespective of the country in which they may have been killed or captured. On January 1 next, the importation, manufacture, purchase, or sale of the plumage of egrets or herons and American pelicans of any species is to be added to the prohibited list.

The Audubon Society of New York state on its part has agreed to endeavor to prevent all illegal interference on the part of game wardens with the millinery trade; to refrain from aiding the passage of any legislation that has for its object the restriction against the importation, manufacture or sale of fancy feathers obtained from domestic fowls, or of the plumage of foreign birds other than those specifically mentioned in the prescribed list.
