REQUIREMENTS OF THE

LAW RECENTLY PASSED

All Infectious and Contagious Diseases Must Be Reported Immediately-The Local Board of Health Will Enforce the Law to the Let

City Recorder Fitz Gerald has a new job on his hands in carrying out provisions of the act passed at last session of the legislature in regard to recording all the city vital statistics for compilation in the re-

port of the state board of health Heretofore in the city there he has been no set plan regarding the rec-ords mentioned and under the new law which went into effect the 21st of this month, a system must be observed as laid down by the act. During the last month, the record-

er has had reported to him several cases of infectious diseases, most of which at the present time are well. Cases Reported During Past Month. The provisions of the law relating to the new system, which will be en-ferced from now on all over the state is found in the General Laws of Oregon, page \$4, and section 8, and reads

Provisions of the Law. In each and every county of the state the county judge and county physician shall constitute a county board of health for said county, and observed of health for said county, and the county physician shall be health officer of the county. If, in any county, it is deemed inexpedient to have a county physician, the county judge shall act as health officer and constitute the county board of health. It shall be the duty of the county board of health to collect all vital statistics, and keep a record thereof, and to report to the secretary of the state board of health monthly, not later than the 10th day, all infectious dis-cases, deaths and the causes thereof, places of burial of every person hav-ing died in said county, and in case of birth of any child giving the name of its parents, their residence and their occupation, that may have been reported to said board of health during the preceding month, excepting cities wherein vital statistics are collected; and, in such cases, the healt. officer, or other person whose duty it is to collect such statistics, must send to the secretary of the state

of births, names of parents, and their places of residence and nationality; and of all infectious diseases report ed to him. Section 12 makes it the duty of any physician, nurse, midwife or the head of any family under whose charge any birth occurs, to report the same to the county or city health officer not later than the last day of that month later than the last day of that month then current. Every death shall be reported within 48 hours or as soon as practicable. Every case of infec-tions or cantagious disease shall be reported immediately. For the viola-tion of any of the provisions of the law a fine of not less than \$10 or more than \$100 can be imposed.
