## ALL WANT PENSIONS

### SPANISH WAR VETERANS HAVE BROKEN RECORD.

More Applications for Pensions Followed Close of Spanish War Than in Any Other Conflict in History of Government.

Washington, D. C., May 29.—Pension Commissioner Ware calls attention to the fact that a greater proportion of the veterans of the Spanish war have applied for pensions than did the veterans of any previous war of the United States in a like period following the close of a national conflict. Most of the applications on file come from members of the volunteer regiments, 65,426 applications of this class now being of record, and all filed since the close of the Spanish war.

In round numbers, over 22 per cent of the men who enlisted for service in the war with Spain have this early applied for pensions. Out of a total number of claims filed, 57,046 are known as "military" claims, filed by the men themselves, and 8350 are "widows and dependents." There have been allowed to date 9881 invalid pensions and 3160 widows and dependents, while 18,185 claims have been rejected.

#### Applications Numerous.

New Applications are being filed daily by the hundreds, and the indications are that by the close of the present year nearly 50 per cent of the men who were enrolled on the army lists during the brief war will have applied to the government for a pension.

This high percentage is said by the department to be due to the activity of pension attorneys. These attorneys have been active among the men who served either in Cuba or in the Philippines, and especially so with widows or dependent relatives of those who were killed or died in the service.

They have induced many men to file claims when there was no chance of securing an allowance, but in the hope of securing a small fee for their pretended service. The high rate of rejections—higher by far than the rate of allowances—indicates the class of claims that have been filed.

#### NOVELTY IN DOG SHOW.

Aristocratic Canine Exhibit By Aristocratic Ladies

New York, May 29.—The first summer dog show of the Ladies' Kennel Association of America opened today on the grounds of Mrs. James L. Kernochan, president of the association, at Hempstead, L. I. The exhibits are benched in large tents, and the show is in the nature of a large garden party.

The exhibits include scores of mastiffs, Great Danes, colts, pointers and bloodhounds, in addition to dogs of smaller variety, and in number and class of entries the exhibition compares favorably with many of the metropolitan shows of its kind.

#### Nevada vs. Utah.

Rego, Nev., May 29.—The debate between representatives of the University of Utah and the University of Nevada takes place at the last-named institution tonight and it promises to be the event of the college year. Utah has the affirmative and Nevada the negative side of the question: "Resolved, That the municipalities of the United States should own and operate telephone, light plants and railroad systems."

#### LIGHTWEIGHT BOXERS.

Gans and Fitzgerald Will Go to a Championship Fight Today.

San Francisco, May 29.—Joe Gans of Baltimore, who wrested the lightweight championship from Frank Erne a year ago, will defend that title at the Yosemite Athletic Club tonight in a 20-round contest with Willie Fitzgerald, of Brooklyn, who recently gave Jimmy Britt such a hard fight in this city. Gans, during the year he has been looked upon as the best 133-pounder, has been an ideal champion, inasmuch as he has fought all comers, and with constant results. Gans' chances in these contests have always been looked upon with favor by shrewd ring followers.

Fitzgerald as compared with Gans, is but little more than a novice in the fighting game. Nevertheless, in his short career he has displayed a prowess that has attracted widespread attention in sporting circles. That Fitzgerald is clever is admitted on all sides. He is quick on his feet and clever at blocking, but whether he possesses a blow sufficiently hard to knock out the colored lad remains to be seen.

The men have agreed to weigh in at 133 pounds at 3 o'clock this afternoon. This weight seems to suit both men and both claimed to be under weight this morning. Eddie Graney has been agreed upon as referee.

#### INTERCOLLEGIATE GAMES.

Great Gathering of College Athletes From All Over the East.

New York, May 29.—The battle of the colleges for track and field honors commenced this afternoon at Berkeley Oval in the presence of an immense throng of spectators. In accordance with a custom that has prevailed for the past three or four years and made necessary by the large number of contestants two days have been allotted to the meeting.

No previous meeting of the Intercollegiate Association has attracted more attention than the present one. The Yale men are doubly anxious to win this year. If they are successful the cup will belong to Yale for good, while if Harvard wins it, it will remain in competition another year. Yale, Harvard, Princeton and Pennsylvania have entered all their veterans and a smashing of records will probably result. Besides these four big universities the crack athletes of Amherst, Williams, Union, Columbia and other colleges will figure in the different events.

#### St. Petersburg's Anniversary.

St. Petersburg, May 29.—St. Petersburg has assumed gala attire in celebration of the 200th anniversary of the founding of the city by Peter the Great. The celebration is to last three days and will be replete with pageants, fetes and other features of interest. Among other things there will be a magnificent procession through the principal streets of the city, followed by a thanksgiving service at the cathedral, at which the czar and all other members of the imperial family will be present. There was opened today an exhibition of the personal belongings of Peter the Great, including the blouse he wore and the tools with which he worked when a ship's carpenter in Holland and England.
