ALL OREGON IS DRY

GRAIN CROP OUTLOOK IS MEDIOCRE EVERYWHERE. Most Promising Crop Reported is Fruit—Hop Crop Will Be Short in Some Localities—Insects Are Injuring Gardens to Some Extent—Grain Crop Generally Below the Average.

In the eastern part of the state the first of the week was cool and a few small showers occurred, after which dry and moderately warm weather prevailed. In the western section the week has been dry; during the first few days the nights were cool, and in some places light frosts occurred; during the later part the temperature rose decidedly, and Sunday the warmest day of the season occurred, with the thermometer registering between 90 and 100 degrees.

Corn also needs rain, but the hot weather has caused it to grow rapidly during the week. Gardens are doing fairly well, but complaints are increasing of damage to squashes, beans and pumpkins by insects. Hops that came up are doing nicely, but quite a number of yards have been abandoned owing to the great number of missing hills. Some alfalfa and early clover has been cut.

Columbia River Valley. Ridgeway, Wasco county, Miss M. U'Ren.—Very warm, with heavy thunder showers last Tuesday; vegetation doing well, but about two weeks later than last year.

Plateau Region. Lakeview, Lake county, W. E. Wheeler.—Everything growing rapidly; prospect good for large fruit and berry crop; outlook for hay good; sheep shearing under way; stock looking well.

Deschutes, Crook county, John Atkinson.—Part of week warm with thunder showers; grass growing nicely; grain looking better, but still backward; stock looking well and gaining fast.

Union, Union county, John W. Minnick.—Grass growing nicely; spring grain coming up unevenly; winter wheat good stand; fruit set heavy; berries are good crop; range stock fast regaining flesh.
