WILL BE LESS TROUBLE.

The Creation of the Blue Mountain Reserve Will Result in Less Friction Between Stockmen,

The usual summer quarrels over grass in the mountains of Grant county will be materially reduced this season, as a result of the range being largely covered by the Blue Mountain reserve, according to T. A. Rhea, a prominent stockman of Heppner. Mr. Rhea is in Portland on business, and says that grazing of sheep is to be permitted as formerly, but under restrictions.

"That is the only way the troubles between stockmen can be averted," he said. "Although sheepmen are, as a rule, opposed to the reserve, which takes in fully 60,000 acres of moun-tains in Morrow county, alone.

"Some trouble has already occur-red over on the John Day, however, where a Morrow county sheepman was arrested last week for driving his band through that county. The pre-text was that the Grant county people feared scab, but the main trouble is that they don't want any Morrow

county sheep over in Grant county under any circumstances."

Troubles between the stockmen of Morrow and Grant counties have Morrow and Grant counties have recurred every summer for the last 10 years, and on several occasions bands of Morrow county sheep have been fired into by cattlemen with Winchester rifles; camps have been burned and herders shot. Scarcity of grass has been the main cause of the grass has been the main cause of the troubles. The sheep of the Morrow county prairies have been driven into the mountains of Grant for 30 years or more, but the mountains have in the meantime been filling up with stockmen, and many who wanted the summer range for themselves. In covering a large portion of the coun ty with a forest reserve. Uncle Sam has caused a stop to be put to the quarreling, and hereafter the grazing of sheep will be regulated in such a way as to avoid overcrowding.

Mr. Rhea says that nearly the whole country has been filed on by timber iand hunters, however, and he won-ders what will become of the rights of these.—Telegram.
