AT OREGON'S FARM

EASTERN OREGON EXPERI-MENT STATION WORK.

New Specie of Forage Grass Propagated-Experiments in Sugar Beet Seed-New Barn Costing \$7000 to Be Built,

The Eastern Oregon experiment station located at Union, is now at the height of the growing season and is one of the most attractive and beautiful tracts of farm and garden land in the state. land in the state.

The rich soil and abundant water supply of Grand Ronde enable the expert in charge, Prof. A. B. Leckenby, to produce in great quantities, every variety of vegetable, fruit and cereal that grows in the temperate

The gardens at the experiment tion are perfect mazes of thrifty, growing plants, showing the splendid results of care, training and cultiva-

The different varieties of shrubs and experimental grasses are given the closest attention, every stage of their growth being carefully noted, and the different changes through which they pass in their development

which they pass in their development are made special studies.

In addition to the famous variety of brome grass originated by Prof. Leckenby, he has propagated another hardy grass which will grow under the most adverse conditions. He is confident that confident that this new specie will prove a boon to the Eastern Oregon Chicago, St Paul, St. Louis, Kan-sas City, St. Joseph, Omaha and lutely no moisture and is so tenacious that it cannot be eaten nor trampled out as the common bunch grass. He expects to raise 2000 pounds of

seed of this specie this season and will make some extensive experiments on the dry foothills with it.
Prof Leckenby will also make extensive experiments in sugar beet seed growing this year. He is making special studies of plants that are adapted to the peculiar soil and climatic conditions of Grand Ronde valley. The German seed that has been imported to Union county is thought to be an inferior grade, com-pared to seed that can be produced

A new barn to cost \$7000 will be built on the grounds this season, Wood Slater, of La Grande having secured the contract. The new city limits of the town of Union now inciude half of the state land in the corporate limits, which will somewhat raise the tax on the property. The young orchard is now coming to maturity and the fruit is in excellent condition. to maturity and excellent condition.

There are many visitors to the sta-tion each day, and the farmers all over Eastern Oregon are becoming more and more interested in the station and are taking advantage of the practical results obtained by the experiments.
