IT IS NOW UP TO COLOMBIA TO HAVE IT OR GIVE IT AWAY.

Claimed by Opponents of the Treaty That France Sold Something to Which She Had No Title—in the Event the Panama Route is Abrogated the Nicaragua Route Goes.

Washington, D. C., June 20.—The Colombian congress convenes today, but in official circles here this is not regarded as bringing the Panama canal treaty any nearer ratification.

According to the news from Bogota the opponents of the treaty will base their objections to its ratification upon the theory that the French company has no rights and has nothing to sell.
