EMPLOYING PRINTERS.

Only Organization of the Kind in America in Session.

Atlantic City, N. J., June 22.—The seventeenth annual convention of the United Typothetae of America will be held here this week. There are about 200 members here now, and it is expected that there will be as many more when the convention begins business tomorrow. The association is made up of the employing printers of the country, and nearly all the leading firms are represented. Among the important problems to come up for consideration are the relations of the employers with labor, with various branches of the supply trade and with the consumers of its product. The national Electrotypers' Association will be in annual meeting here at the same time and a joint session of the two bodies for the discussion of matters of mutual interest will be held.

OREGON SHORT LINE DEAL.

Merger Expected With What is Called "The San Pedro."

New York, June 22.—In railroad and financial circles it is expected that the deal between Senator Clark and E. H. Harriman, by which the San Pedro road is to acquire 450 miles of the Oregon Short Line, will be closed in New York within a day or two. A meeting to ratify the sale is to be held this week and will be attended by Senator Clark, Senator Kearns and other directors and officials of the roads concerned. Considerable interest is manifested in the deal in Wall street because of the effect it will have on the plans of George Gould for the completion of his transcontinental road.

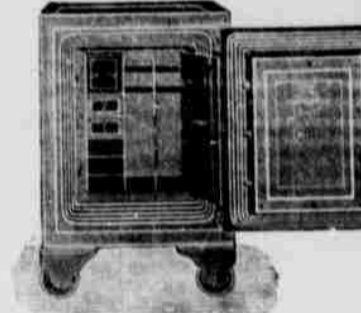

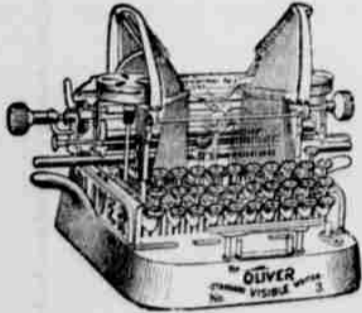
