## SALARIES RAISED

OREGON POSTMASTERS WILL GET MORE MONEY.

On July 1 Nearly Every City in the State Will Enjoy an Increase Salary Rate—Business Justifies the Advance.

The salaries of the postmasters of Salem, Pendleton, Eugene, Oregon City, Ashland, Roseburg, Grants Pass, Corvallis, McMinnville, Medford, Hood River, Marshfield, Union, Hillsboro, Newberg, Tillamook, Burns, Independence, Silverton, Milton, Huntington and Woodburn, as will be seen below, will be increased \$100 a year on July 1. This does not mean that other cities like Baker City, La Grande, Astoria and Albany, are not growing, too; only that their postoffice receipts do not quite justify the increase at this time. But all Oregon towns are growing right along, and they are doing so because the country surrounding them is being developed, because population and products are increasing, because Oregon, "with her own wings," is constantly rising to a higher and broader flight.

### RECEIVES THE KING'S MEDAL.

American Architect Receives Rare Recognition.

London, June 22.—At the annual meeting today of the Royal Institute of British Architects Charles F. McKim, the celebrated New York architect, was formerly invested with the Royal Gold Medal for the Promotion of Architecture. The investiture was attended with simple but interesting ceremonies and took place in the presence of a notable gathering. Tomorrow Mr. McKim will be the guest of honor at a banquet to be given by the institute, and to which Ambassador Choate and other men of prominence have been invited.

### An Architect of Renown.

New York, June 22.—Charles F. McKim, who was today presented with the king's gold medal in connection with the work of the Royal Institute of British Architects is a member of the firm of McKim, Mead & White, of this city and an architect of renown. He was born in Chester county, Pa., in 1845. His first outlined study of architecture was at the Lawrence Scientific School at Harvard University in 1865 and 1867. He then went to Paris and spent three years at the Ecole des Beaux Arts. Soon after that he returned to New York and became a member of the well-known firm with which he is still connected. He is the designer of the Columbia University buildings, the public library of Boston and other prominent buildings throughout the country.

### CHRISTIANS IN CONVENTION.

Members of the Church in Iowa Are Convened.

Des Moines, Iowa, June 22.—The Christian churches of Iowa began their annual convention here today and will be in session through the greater part of the week. Today was devoted to a review of the business of the Christian Women's Board of Missions. The convention proper will open tomorrow evening at which time there will be a report by E. S. Denny of Des Moines, the corresponding secretary, and an address by T. A. Abbott of Kansas City. A number of other noted speakers of the church will be heard during the week.
