COURT DECISIONS

TWO OPINIONS AFFECTING EASTERN OREGON.

County Road Question in Wallowa County is Threshed Over and Settled—Supreme Court Reviews and Decides Important Cases.

Major Leo Moorhouse, deputy clerk of the Oregon supreme court, received this morning the following opinions rendered by the court at Salem yesterday:

I. H. Moore, appellant, vs. T. W. Halliday, administrator of the estate of J. H. Chandler, deceased, respondent; appeal from Malheur county; Hon. M. D. Clifford, judge; affirmed; opinion by Chief Justice Moore. This was a suit to quiet title to certain real property and to enjoin threatened continuance of trespassers thereon. The questions decided by the supreme court were that the homesteader before he has received his patent cannot maintain suit to quiet title, although he might enjoin interference with his right of possession; also that an injunction will not be granted to restrain cutting of grass or other trespass which does not work irreparable injury to the real property.

Wallowa county, respondent, vs. Aaron Wade, appellant; appeal from Wallowa county; Hon. Robert Eakin, judge; affirmed; opinion by Justice Bean. This was a suit to enjoin defendant from obstructing the public highway. The road in question passed through two sections of land in Wallowa county, which were taken up as homesteads in 1901, except 40 acres, which was settled in 1896. The road was established by the county court in 1888, and had been in use as such since 1889. In 1901 the defendant, by permission of homestead claimants, built fences across it, and the plaintiff sued to enjoin the maintenance of such fences. The trial court rendered a decree in favor of the plaintiff and the defendant appealed upon the contention that the petition upon which the statutory proceedings were based was insufficient to give the court jurisdiction. The supreme court affirmed the decision of the lower court, holding that the road was a public highway. Having become under such statutory proceedings, dedication and acceptance and prescription and user, and as the road had been in use 13 years, this was sufficient to amount to an acceptance of a grant made by congress and for the establishment of a highway over the state land, either by dedication or prescription.
