OREGON WILL IMPROVE HER MEANS OF PUNISHMENT.

New Buildings and Quarters for Prisoners-Execution Chamber Will Be Isolated From Other Parts of Penitentiary.

Salem, June 26.-The changes and improvements which Governor Chamberlain is having made at the state prison provides for suitable quarters for female prisoners. Tais is an improvement that has long been desired. The female quarters are to be con-structed in the north end of the new wing, on the third floor. This portion of the new wing now consists two stories. The ground floor is no two stories. The ground floor is no occupied by the kitchen, commissar; engine room and large shower but room. The second floor was inteneed for a community dining room, be has never been used for that purpose it is being used as a hospital.

The roof of the building will be raised high enough to permit of the construction of an additional story. The second floor will then be used a

The second floor will then be used a dining hall and the third floor w be partitioned off for a hospital room drug room, linen rooms and fema quarters. A steel eage will be co-structed in one corner of the dining room, high enough so as to be out reach of men on the floor, and in the an armed guard will be stationed while the prisoners are in the dinit room. The dining room will be 1: feet long by 50 feet wide. There wi be two cells for female prisoner each cell being 20 by 25 feet ar lighted by three windows opening t ward the east and north. Each cell will have connected with it a toller room and bath tub. The cells are separated by a wide hall, opening into a corridor, in which the prisoners may walk if the prison management desires. The size of the rooms and desires. The size of the rooms and their location will make the accom-modations for female prisoners as good as could be expected at prison. The hospital room will be by 60 feet, with toilet and bath ad

the new execution room will be erect-ed. This structure will be about 30 by 40 feet, and two stories high. The first floor will be occupied by four steel cells, for condemned prisoners. In one corner of the room and at one side of the front of the cells will be a steel cage, in which an armed guard may watch the prisoners.

The execution chamber will be on the second floor, a gallows with two traps being constructed on the west the room will be a steel cage for a guard. A stairway will lead directly from the ground floor to the gallows. The stage in which the traps are placed will be about 11 by 26 feet. The execution room will have no con-nection with the wing or main building except that a small wicket is pro-vided through which food may be passed from the commissary department for the prisoners confined in the death chamber. The entrance to the execution room will be from the east, and out or sight of the convicts confined in the main buildings
