CATHOLICS OF OHIO

FEDERATED SOCIETIES IN SESSION AT COLUMBUS.

Will Elect Delegates to the National Federation Which Will Be Held in August at Atlantic City—This is the First State to Institute a Union of the Church's Secular Societies.

Columbus, O., June 27.—A large and representative attendance is promised at the third annual convention of the Ohio Federation of Catholic Societies, which is to begin here tomorrow and continue for four days. At this convention delegates to the national convention of the American Federation of Catholic Societies, to be held at Atlantic City in August, will be elected, and many important issues of interest to Catholics will be discussed.

Making Great Progress.

The reports to be presented to the convention show that the federation movement is making gratifying progress in Ohio. During the past 12 months the membership has increased from 10 to 29 county federations, and numbers among its society membership the Catholic Knights of Ohio, the Catholic Order of Foresters, the Knights of Columbus, the Knights of St. John, the Ancient Order of Hibernians, the Catholic Total Abstinence Union, the Young Men's Institute, the Catholic Benevolent Legion and many parish and church societies. Ohio is the pioneer state in the federation movement, and it took the lead in forming the national federation, which is now spread over the entire country.

Next week's convention will be presided over by T. B. Minahan, president of the national federation, and also head of the state organization.
