part of the state were mineral lands the state was enabled to relinquish them to the general government, and to take other and more valuable lands in lieu thereof.

In heir thereof, Many of these sections which were thus relinquished to the government had already been sold by the state to private parties. The lieu land was also sold before the validity of the base had been finally determined, and now that the selections are being dismoved on the second then the disapproved on the ground that the mineral character of the land was not properly shown, all the purchasers of such school lands or lieu lands are in doubt as to the condition of their titles

# Must Give Back Eventually.

Where there has been double selling the state must eventually return to one purchaser or the other the money he has paid, together with interest at 5 per cent. One class of purchas-ers must lose title to the land where there has been double selling, and, whichever loses, the state will b censured for permitting its land affairs to get into such a muddle.

The problem before Governor Cham berlain, who has charge of the state lieu land business, is not what should been done by the previous administration but what can be done now to get the state out of a bad predicament. The governor has decided to give his sanction to the appeals and has expressed his desire that the state's selection of lieu lands be ap proved.

The approval of the lieu land selec tions will undoubtedly be most profit-able to the state, for the lieu land was sold for double the price paid for the school sections in place. In the the school sections in place. In the contest between two classes of pur-chasers it is very likely, indeed, al-most certain, that the identity of the purchasers of the school land in place will be disclosed. has been contended by General

H. Odell, who has charge of the edication of mineral base for the W state, that the school sections involv ed in this contest were purchased by land grabbers who employed stool pigeons in order to get conveyances from the state. He takes th position that since the purchasers are mere speculators who secured the land in violation of law and in anticipation of the creation of a forest reserve they are not entitled to any protection from the state,




