GENERAL NEWS.

Mill dust caused a big fire a few days ago in a Milwaukee brewing company's grain warehouses.

The Mantla Railway & Lighting Co., with a capital of \$6,000,000, has been incorporated under the laws of Connecticut.

King Edward has suggested that Sir Thomas Lipton serve as guide to the Prince and Princess of Wales when they attend the World's Fair in 1904.

John Engvahl has confessed to a robbery of \$15,000 worth of jewels from a Los Angeles hotel, but claims to have been robbed of the proceeds by his pals.

The annual row in Kansas is on between the governor and the prohibitionists who want assistant attorney generals appointed to help enforce the prohibitory law.

Tennessee has a local option law under the operation of which all but eight towns in the state having fewer than 5,000 inhabitants have gone dry. The supreme court lately held the law to be constitutional.

By a recent raid on the headquarters of a Paris thief \$200,000 worth of art treasures were recovered. The offender, Parmagglan, was a fence for thieves who operated in all the large cities of the world.

A famous middle-states horseman, James McCann, a Kentuckian of wealth, was murdered lately at St. Louis. Robbery, revenge and a few hidden motives were behind the deed, which was in every sense mysterious.

A recently-enacted Mexican law enormously increases the tariff on American corn after July 1. Its operation has been suspended for a month, however, as a relief measure for Mexican flood sufferers on the Lower Rio Grande.

NORTHWEST NEWS.

Iwaco is to have a new salmon cannery in operation by July 10.

The latest news from the Yukon is to the effect that the river is lower now than at any time in several years.

Saturday last, near Canyonville, a falling tree knocked off the entire top of George Higgins' head, instantly killing him.

The run of salmon at the mouth of the Columbia and at Baker's bay has greatly increased in the past two or three days.

A skeleton was found Friday last at Oregon City under nine feet of solid rock, while sewer excavations were being made.

June 27 the 11-year-old son of Albert Shinn, of Hot Creek, shot himself accidentally through the body with a .22-calibre rifle and died in a few minutes.

Thomas H. Pittam, of Spokane, who was convicted last spring of swindling the McCormick Harvester Co., lost his appeal to the supreme court Friday last.

George T. Howard, an Oregon City merchant disappeared June 20. It has since been ascertained that he left liabilities between \$5000 and \$10,000, and assets amounting to \$4,000.

Dr. A. P. Stowell, of the Washington state board of health, reported Saturday last that there are but four cases of smallpox in Clarke county, instead of 100 as reported. Vancouver is in Clarke county.

Marian Armstrong's suit to recover from the town of Cosmopolis, on Gray's Harbor, for the death of her husband, who fell off a bridge while intoxicated a year ago and was drowned, has failed in the supreme court.

J. R. Watkins, a night watchman in Portland confessed Saturday last to several burglaries. He has lately been telling fairy tales of encounters with burglars who have heretofore gotten credit for the robberies committed by Watkins.

H. St. John Dix of Whatcom, Wash., was last Saturday released on \$6,000 bail pending an appeal of his case to the supreme court. He was sentenced a year ago to 10 years in the penitentiary, having been convicted of wrecking the Scandinavian-American bank of Whatcom.

CHANGE FOR CADETS

YOUNG MEN NEEDED IN REVENUE CUTTER SERVICE.

Salaries From \$500 to \$1400 Per Year —Promotions Come Very Quickly and the Qualifications Not Very Numerous—Appointments Will Be Made Last of July.

During the present summer President Roosevelt will be called upon to appoint eight or 10 cadets in the revenue cutter service, places that pay a salary of \$500 a year, and after two years of good service lead to appointments as lieutenants at \$1,400 per annum. To provide an eligible list from which these appointments will be made the civil service commission will hold examinations all over the country on July 29, 30 and 31, and the candidates making the highest averages will be recognized by the president when he comes to fill vacancies soon to be created.

Appointments Sought.

Appointments to the revenue cutter service are much sought after, for the rank and pay compares favorably with that of the army and navy, and cadets are commissioned after two years' service, whereas cadets from the naval academy must serve six years before they become lieutenants. Applicants for the revenue cutter cadetship, who take the coming examinations, must be between the ages of 18 and 25, of vigorous constitution, physically sound and well formed, not less than 5 feet 3 inches in height, of good moral character and unmarried.

It is not necessary to show past service on seagoing vessels, although such service is advantageous to applicants. The prescribed examination includes spelling, arithmetic, algebra, general geography, geometry, general history, physics, general information on current topics, trigonometry, grammar, rhetoric and composition, English literature and one modern language, French German or Spanish.

Information for Applicants.

Under the recent act of congress, captains of the revenue cutter service rank with majors in the army, first lieutenants with first lieutenants and third lieutenants with second lieutenants.

Congress has also provided for the retirement of officers of the revenue cutter service at the age of 64, with 75 per cent of the pay and allowances of the rank upon which they were retired.

There are 36 captains in the service at present, drawing \$2,500 per annum and about the same number of lieutenants of each grade, drawing \$1,800, \$1,500 and \$1,400, according to rank.

Notification of the proposed examinations have been sent to all members of congress, and notice is there in given that persons who desire to enter this examination should at once apply to the United States civil service commission, Washington, D. C., or to the secretary of the local board of examiners.

Examinations of candidates for appointment as cadets in the revenue cutter service are held each year, to fill vacancies caused by the promotion of officers already in the service.
