RIDGE AND VICINITY

ESCAPE FROM DROWNING IN JACK CREEK CANYON.

Very Favorable Weather for Crops—Grasshoppers Continue to Be a Nuisance—Several Wells Washed Full of Mud and Crossings Washed Out—Purchases of Beef Cattle.

Ridge, July 2.—Your correspondent will give a few details of the narrow escape of Mrs. Henry Belts and her family from being drowned in the Jack Canyon waterspout. Mrs. Belts lives on Birch creek, about half a mile above Pilot Rock and about half a mile below the confluence of Jack canyon and Birch creek. When she discovered the flood, with her five children and a little girl who had been visiting them, she hurried to the hill which she reached in safety. She then returned to the house after some papers and pictures which she prized highly. When she reached the house she waded waist deep in the water. The mud settled in the house about six inches deep, and it took four people from two to three days to clear out the mud and straighten the house. She also had about 30 dozen eggs which she was holding for higher prices, but as she said, they suddenly rose and she let them go.

GENERAL NEWS.

The Manitou hotel at Manitou, Col., was burned yesterday. Loss \$100,000, partly covered by insurance.

A smelter belonging to the Hearst estate burned yesterday at Silver City, N. M., which was valued at \$100,000.

The widow of Charles A. Dana, the famous journalist, died in New York yesterday, aged 79, from the effects of a fall.

One thousand watches consigned from Switzerland to the United States were stolen before they reached Brussels.

More precious stones were imported through the New York City port last year than in any one year before. The valuation reached \$27,300,000.

Last year the New York City post-office issued money orders to the value of \$218,313,000, an increase of \$31,326,000 over the preceding year.

Lotta M. Crabtree, the actress, has sold out her San Francisco belongings and gone East to live. She realized \$50,000 for one piece of realty that cost her \$12,000.

Of coins of every description, from pennies to double eagles, 19,578,766 more pieces were coined by the federal government last year than during the year previous.
