MEXICAN POLITICS ANY TIME

PRESIDENT DIAZ INSISTS ON BEING PRESIDENT AGAIN

European Bondholders Are Interested in the Succession and Ambitious Politicians as Well-His Present Resolution a Surprise, as it Was Supposed He Would Retire,

City of Mexico, July 3.—The unan-nous nomination by the liberal nion convention of President Diaz union as a candidate to succeed himself, and his re-election to the presidency, which is a foregone result of the general election which takes place general election which takes place this month while it could not be otherwise than satisfactory to the people of Mexico generally, is still a cause of some anxiety in the minds of those who have the welfare of the republic sincerely at heaft and who look forward to the time when the "maker of modern Mexico is no more. The decision of Presount Diaz to stand for re-election was somewhat of a surprise even to his most intimate political associates. His advanced age—he was born in 1830—makes it imperative for the nation to look about for an able sucnation to look about for an able successor to take the reins of government when death causes the hand that has so long and so successfully guided the car of state to release its

Anxious Bondholders. It is publicly known test the financiers of Europe desire the retire-ment of President Diaz solely because they wish the matter of the succes to be arranged during his life-This has been one of the conditions the Rothschilds have made when appealed to for a great loan to place Mexico on a golu standard. They fear that the president will die suddenly with the result that the country will be plunged in confusion and that a soldier will then seize the presidency, that civil troubles will en-sue and in which case the bondhold-ers would be the principal sufferers. Diaz has hitherto been known to

admit that he fully realized the force of this argument in favor of his reof this argument in tavor of his re-tirement and was willing to sacrifice himself to the situation. Conse-quently his decision to accept an-other term of office is all the more surprising. The three other candi-dates mentioned for the honor were Limantour, Menas and Marischal, but now that Diaz has accepted the re-nomination, they have quit the race in favor of the incumbent.

Two Ambitious Aspirants.
It is well understood that those who have large financial interests in Mexico would like to see J. Ives Li-mantour secure the presidency, as he is considered by far the most able financiar and diplomat the republic has yet produced. He was acting president of Mexico during the visit of Diaz to the United States in 1901, aind has always been considered the choice of Diaz for his successor, al-though he is run close in that re-spect and in the favor of the Mexican aristocrats by General Bernardo Reyes who as secretary of war and head of the army, has strong claims to the place. General Reyes has a prore engaging personality than Senor Limantour, but he has lost some of his popularity by showing too plainly his aspirations for presidential bonors. In the event of the death of Diaz while in office the presidency would devolve temporarily at least on Senor Marischal, the present sec-ctary of the senate, and who would serve until a general election could be held.
