

TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND PEOPLE AT ATLANTA, GA

All the Southern, Middle Western Northern and New England States and Canada Are Represented-Chorus of One Hundred Voices-An Emergency Hospital Provided.

Atlanta, Ga. July 7.—Atlanta is nearly all agog completing arrange-ments for the international conven-tion of the Baptist Young People's tion of the Baptist Young People's Union. The scheduled arrivals commence this evening, but the great rush of delegates and visitors will not be on until tomorrow morning. Throughout the day the trains will come in quick succession until late in the evening with delegates from Tennessee, West Virginia, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Massachusetts, Connecticut, Maine, New York, Iowa, Kansas, Indiana, Missouri, Vermont, Nebraska, Michigan, Colorado Dako-Nebraska, Michigan, Colorado, Dako-tas, Texas and Ohio, besides many parts of the Dominion of Canada. A crowd of at least 25,000 is counted on, or which more than 5,000 will be regularly accredited delegates and the remainder visitors.

Every precaution is taken to min-imize the causes of accidents, and "Smoking prohibited" will be a con-spicuous placard in the great aunispicious piacard in the great audi-torium at Piedmont park, where the general sessions are to be held. The medical staff of the convention is completing hospital arrangements so that prompt aid may be afforded and the visitors put to no expense for emergency attendance.

The auditorium and also a number of churches which are to be utilized for convention purposes are being elaborately decorated with the four colors of the Baptist Union, viz.: Green, for Southern section: blue, west of Mississippi river; gold, east of the Mississippi, and red for Canada.

One of the most interesting and at-tractive features of the gathering will be the musical program. This is in charge of Professor Porter, of Baltimore, who has trained a grand chorus of 1,000 voices, which will give a concert tomorrow night and also render selections in the inter-

vals of the convention sessions.

President John H. Chapman, of Chicago, will call the gataering to order Thursday morning and over the opening session. Addresses of welcome will be delivered by Gov-ernor Terrell, Mayor Howell, Ex-Governor Northern and others
