about 90 feet and the breadth in the widest part about 22 feet. Beneath the cigar-shaped balloon is suspended the bamboo framework carrying the one or two passengers, the petrol motor, the screw tractor or propeller, and the rudder. The motor is placed in the front half of the framework, the car in the back half. The propeller is fixed in front, the rudder at the rear. Everything is worked from the car by an apparatus similar to that used for operating the brake on cycles.

The airship with which the successful experiments were made last year was of four horse-power, while the new ship is of 24 horse-power. The maximum speed of the former was 10 miles an hour, and of the latter 30 miles an hour. The two-blade screw tractor for propelling the ship is 12 feet in length. The rudder consists of a silk-covered framework. The airship is capable of carrying two passengers, but for the initial trip tomorrow the daring inventor will be unaccompanied.

As to the power of the airship, Mr. Spencer says it will be able to go through any wind the velocity of which does not exceed 30 miles an hour. Extended journeys are planned by the inventor, and he says he hopes to provide surprises for the spectators.

GOOD CITIZENSHIP DAY.

Christian Endeavor Convention at Denver Discusses Civic Issues. Denver, Col., July 10.—This was "good citizenship" day in the Christian Endeavor convention. At nearly all the meetings of the day the reports, addresses, presentations and songs tended toward the subject, and the leading speakers, among them District Attorney Joseph W. Folk, of St. Louis, were men whose fame is the result of their efforts for municipal and state reform.

Many thousand delegates began the day, as they did yesterday, with devotions. Morning prayer meetings were held in a score of churches at 6:30 o'clock. Many impromptu meetings were held on the streets, and many a toiler in store or factory lingered to take part in the services on the way to work. An hour before the entrance to Tent Endeavor was opened, City Park was thronged with several thousand persons who sang Endeavor songs while they waited for the services to begin. The big tent was the scene of an almost continuous session throughout the day, the addresses of eminent speakers being interspersed with prayer and with stirring Christian hymns. One of the most interesting and novel features of the gathering is scheduled for tonight, when several thousand of the enthusiastic young delegates will assemble on the steps of the Colorado state capitol and unite in singing the stirring songs for which the organization is famous.

CHAPMAN IS RE-ELECTED.

Overflow Meeting Held in the Atlanta Churches.

Atlanta, Ga., July 10.—This has been another busy day for the delegates to the international convention of the Baptist Young People's Union. A large number attended the sunrise meetings, which were held in the different churches between 6 and 7 o'clock, but owing to the warm weather the large majority waited until later in the day to offer their devotions.

There was no room to spare in the mammoth meeting place when President Chapman called the convention to order. The features of the convention were the election of officers and the reports of state work. It was generally conceded that John H. Chapman, of Chicago, would again be selected as president, and when the nominating committee presented his name he received an ovation. After the election President Chapman was introduced and thanked the delegates for the honor paid him. The presentation of banners was another interesting feature of the day's program. "Workers' conferences" were held in a number of churches this afternoon. Delegates and visitors who did not assist at these conferences, piloted by one or more members of the reception committee, enjoyed the afternoon making short excursions or taking drives or walks through the public parks and to points of interest in the city.

Too Large for the Mills.

Tacoma, Wash., July 10.—The Capitol Box Company, of this city, today received what is said to be the largest log ever loaded on Puget Sound. It measures 9x15x40 feet, and contains 21,000 feet of lumber. It came from the Skagit river, and no mill in this state is large enough to cut it, and consequently it must be blown open with powder.
