

GOVERNMENT BUILDING AT ST. LOUIS A PERFECT DREAM.

Will Be the Most Imposing Structure of its Kind in the World-Will Be Dalles and Pendleton. Half Classic in Style-Sculpture Will Be Symbolical of Peace.

Work upon the giant structure in which the United States government exhibits are to be installed at the World's Fair, is progressing well, Many various of the structural steel have arrived and more is on the way. The building is the largest structure ever built by governmental au-thority for any exposition. It is 800x 250 jeet and \$450,000 was set aside for its construction. The government building occupies a commanding site on'n bill in the extreme eastern

The general style of the building is pseudo classic. The central pavil-ion with the colonnade on either side. forms a portico 15 feet wide and 524 feet long. 50 feet above the general level of the other buildings, from which a splendid view is permitted

An attle 15 feet high, surmounts the colonnade sor lonic column and this is righly embellished with statues. The dome aurmounting the central pavilion is 100 feet in dame-ter and in a general way is designed after the Pantheon at Rome. The top of the quadriga which surmounts it, is 175 feet above the ground. The sculpture displayed is symbolic of the republic and the arts of peace.
