GREEK VERSUS JAP

RAILROAD COMPANIES ARE CHANGING LABORERS.

Japs Not a Success as Workingmen—Importation From Southern Europe Not Much Better—Both Are Contract Laborers.

The railroad corporations of the West are tiring of the Jap, as a track laborer and are jumping out of the "frying pan into the fire" by hiring a mongrel horde of Greeks, which possesses all the faults and none of the virtue of the Japs.

The Jap becomes so independent, after a couple of years in the United States that it is impossible to depend upon him with any certainty. He quarrels with the white boss, works only when he feels inclined, and becomes dissipated. The fact of the matter is, 10 Japs will not do the work of five good white men on a track, and they never do the work as intelligently. They are quick to learn, saving of their money, and very dutiful for the first year, but become headstrong and unbearable with longer acquaintance. They are constantly changing their location, removing from gang to gang and are an endless source of trouble to the track department.

As a relief from this condition, the companies are now bringing into the country, as fast as they can induce them to shake off their attachments that bind them to the stumps and cesspools of Europe, a horde of Greek, and mongrel laborers. This addition to the population of the country is no better than the Jap, as they are foreign to every American idea and instinct, and not so cleanly, personally, as the Jap. They are more slow to learn the work required of them and more dissipated after a short residence than the Jap. Most of these people calling themselves Greeks are mongrels from Sicily and Sardinia, Macedonians with an Italian tinge, renegade Bulgarians and Tyrolean laborers and a general collection of promiscuous nativity, which would stagger the bureau of ethnology to figure out.

As many of these so-called Greeks speak Italian as Greek. Not one in 40 of them know a Greek letter when they see it and not many of them write letters home in any language, while the Jap is a greater letter-writer than the American workman.

About the only advantage to the country in general of the Greek laborer over the Jap, is that the Greek buys and eats more American products than the Jap. The basis of the food of the Japs is the Soy or bean juice, which they ship here in casks and which enters into every meal with more or less regularity. The basis of the meal of the Greek is bread, and the oven is the first possession of the gang of Greeks. The Greeks are not as cleanly as the Japs. They do not acquire one-half the civility to strangers as the Jap and are more channish and insolent. Their general appearance is little better than that of the Asiatic, and their intellectual gifts are not so great.

The main point of resemblance between the two classes, however, is the fact that both are contract laborers under a system of padronism, which destroys their value as citizens. They are nothing more nor less than slaves under the Greek or Jap contractor, until they learn enough of American practices to throw off their bondage and look for a job on their own account.
